ATLANTA TAKES GILMER 26-6

Atlanta, Sept. 18. Football fans at the Bivins-Trice Stadium saw a heavy, experienced line lead the way for a light, fast, back-field and over power a scrappy Gilmer Team. Eyes were focused on little Larry Smith, Rabbit fullback, who ran amuck over the desperate Buckeyes. Smith and Clements acted as captains.

MT. PLEASANT NO MATCH FOR RABBITS, FALL 33-0

Mt. Pleasant, Sept. 25. In their second game of the year the Rabbits again showed signs of a powerhouse. Using wide open tactics, Murdock, Atlanta quarter-back, guided the way to a landslide victory over the Tigers. Hefner and Davis were co-captains.

RABBITS ROAR AT LIONS 58-0

New Boston, Oct. 3. The Atlanta Rabbits made their bid for the District 21-A Championship by rolling over New Boston and remaining undefeated in three games. The Rabbit forward wall was as one in halting the Lions running attack. Captains for the first conference game were Bluestein and Daniel.

RABBITS CRUSH JAMES BOWIE 60-0

Atlanta, Oct. 10. Scoring at will against a helpless Pirate eleven, the entire Rabbit squad paraded over the field. Showing power in every phase passing, running, blocking, and tackling the Rabbits were never threatened. Bradford and Warren, speed halfbacks, were acting captains.

DE KALB NO TEST FOR RABBITS, DROP 42-7

Atlanta: The team many people felt would stop the Rabbits' winning streak fell before the same devastating power four other teams before them had felt. It was a last minute desperation play that allowed DeKalb their score. Acting captains: Nichols and Murdock.

RABBITS BEAT DANGERFIELD 66-0

Atlanta, Oct. 24. Running centers, guards, and tackles, the home team really went wild and piled up the largest score of the season. Scores were made by Hap Clements, Hefner, Bradford, Nichols, Smith, Teel, and B. Boone. Captains were Long and Smith.

ATLANTA ROUTS HUGHES SPRINGS 52-0

Hughes Springs, Oct. 31. The Rabbits racked up their seventh victory of the year by decisively trouncing the Mustangs of Hughes Springs. Smith lead the scoring with three six pointers. Shuttlesworth and Hap Clements acted as captains.

ATLANTA DOWNS NAPLES 38-7

Naples, Nov. 7. The Rabbits stayed undefeated by taking the Hornets of Naples 38-7. Cannaday held out his first team a greater part of the game for next week. Davis and Fitts were captains.

RABBITS TAKE JEFFERSON 20-7

Jefferson, Nov. 14. Amid mud, screaming fans, and under heavy presure, the Atlanta eleven coolly walked away with a wonderful victory under their belts. Meeting their strongest opposition of the year the Rabbits again came through. Hero of the game was Bradford, who, after being out for two weekd from injuries, entered the ball game and on the next play carried the leather 37 yards for the first score of the game. Captains were Murdock and Davis.

ATLANTA COPS DISTRICT TITLE CROWN WITH 33-0 WIN OVER LINDEN

Atlanta, Nov. 20. Under a heavy downpour the Rabbits repeated for the third time as District Champs by burying the Linden Tigers in a sea of mud with a tricky running attact that even ankle deep mud could not stop. The Atlanta line was at their peak, by holding Linden back to a minus 7 yards and no first downs for the night. Hap Clements and Smith were captains.

ATLANTA FALLS TO WHITE OAK 42-13

Marshall, Dec. 4. Not being able to match the scoring of the White Oak Roughnecks, the Atlanta eleven bowed out of the Region VI Championship race. Captalizing on three big breaks, the Roughnecks scored 21 points in the first half without making a first down. Hefner, scoring from passes from Murdock, made Atlanta's two tallies in the first half. Murdock and Clements acted as captains.

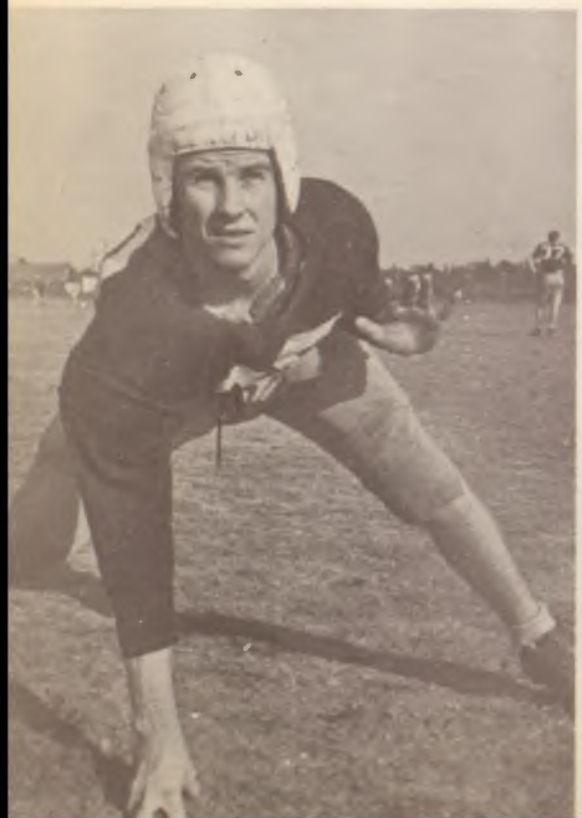

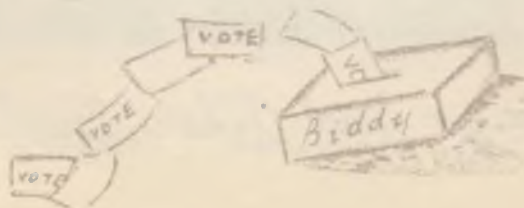

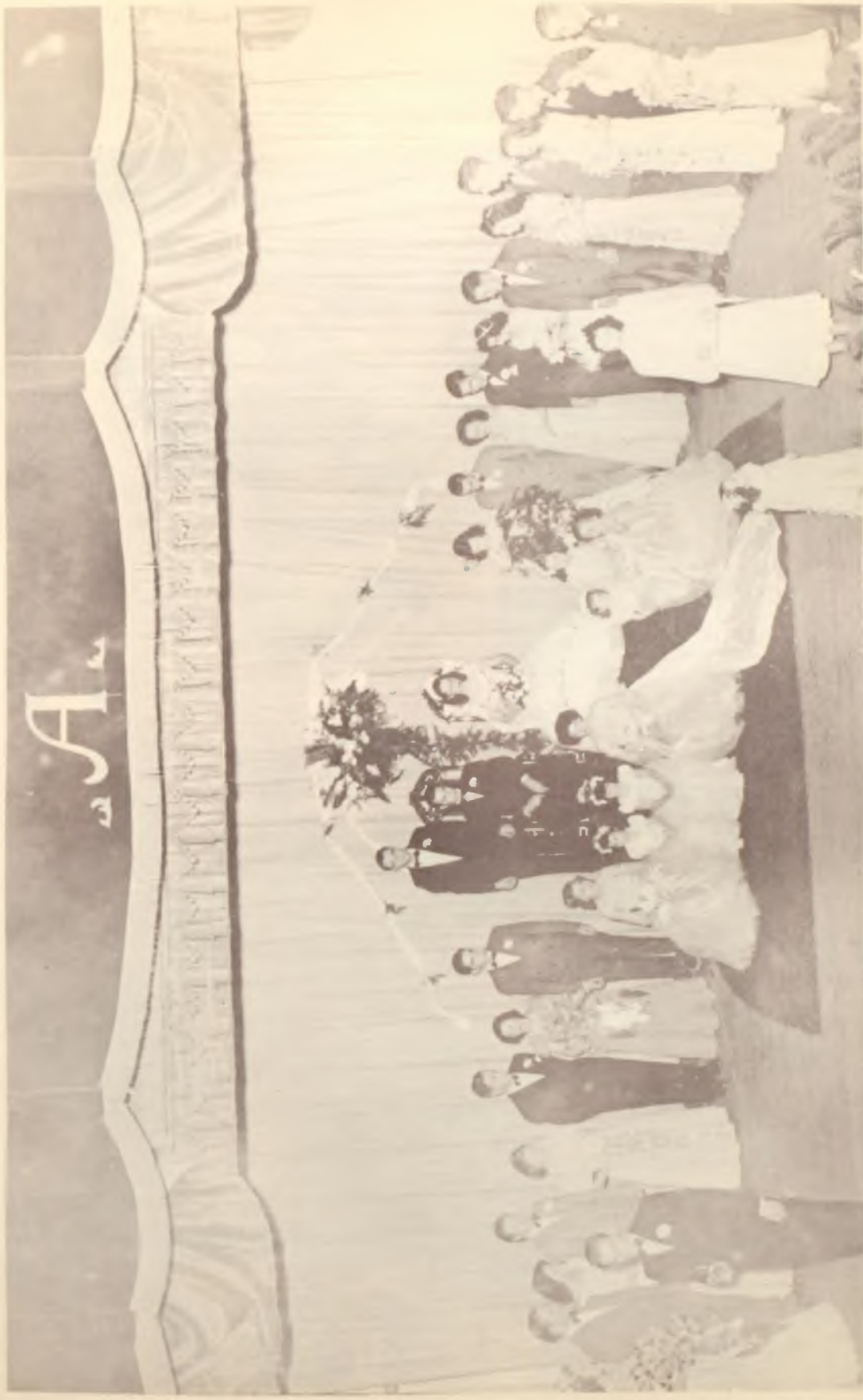
Miss Biddy Cook Wins Queen's Race

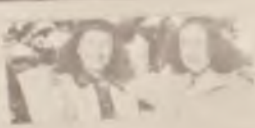

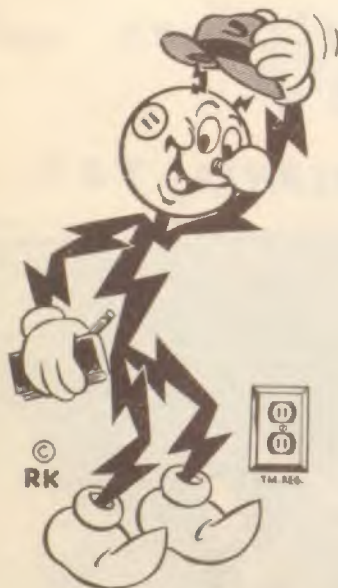

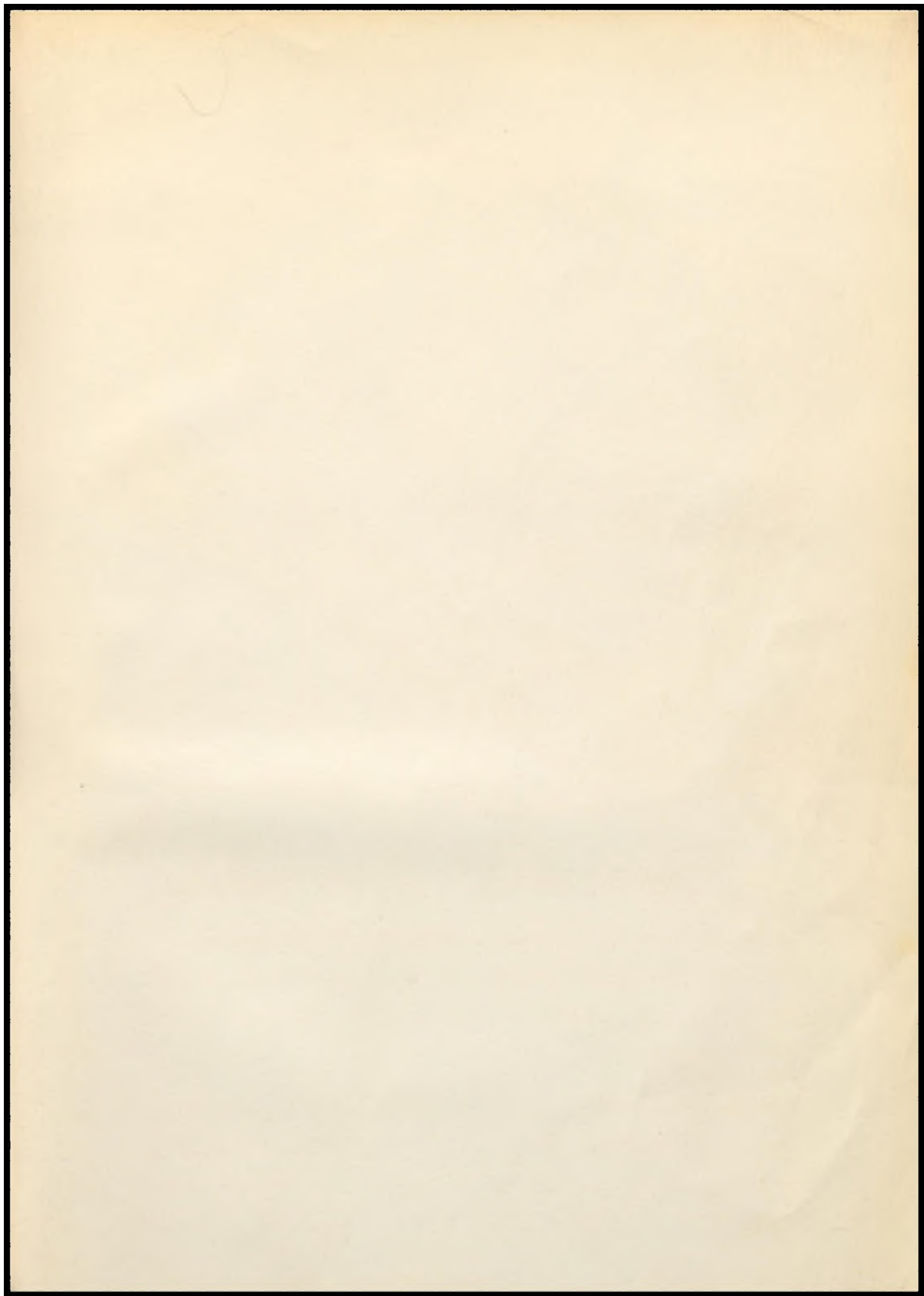
