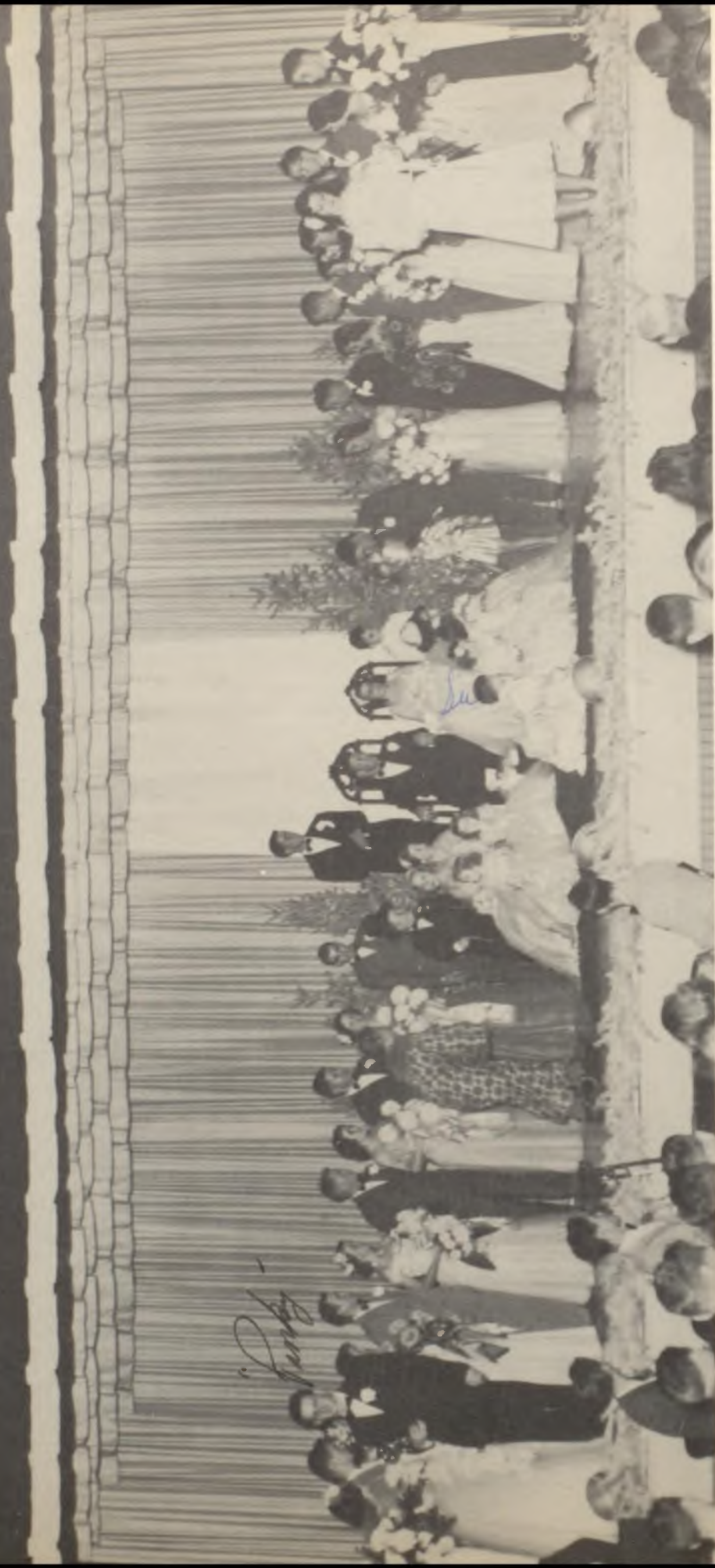
#### P. T. A. HALLOWEEN CARNIVAL

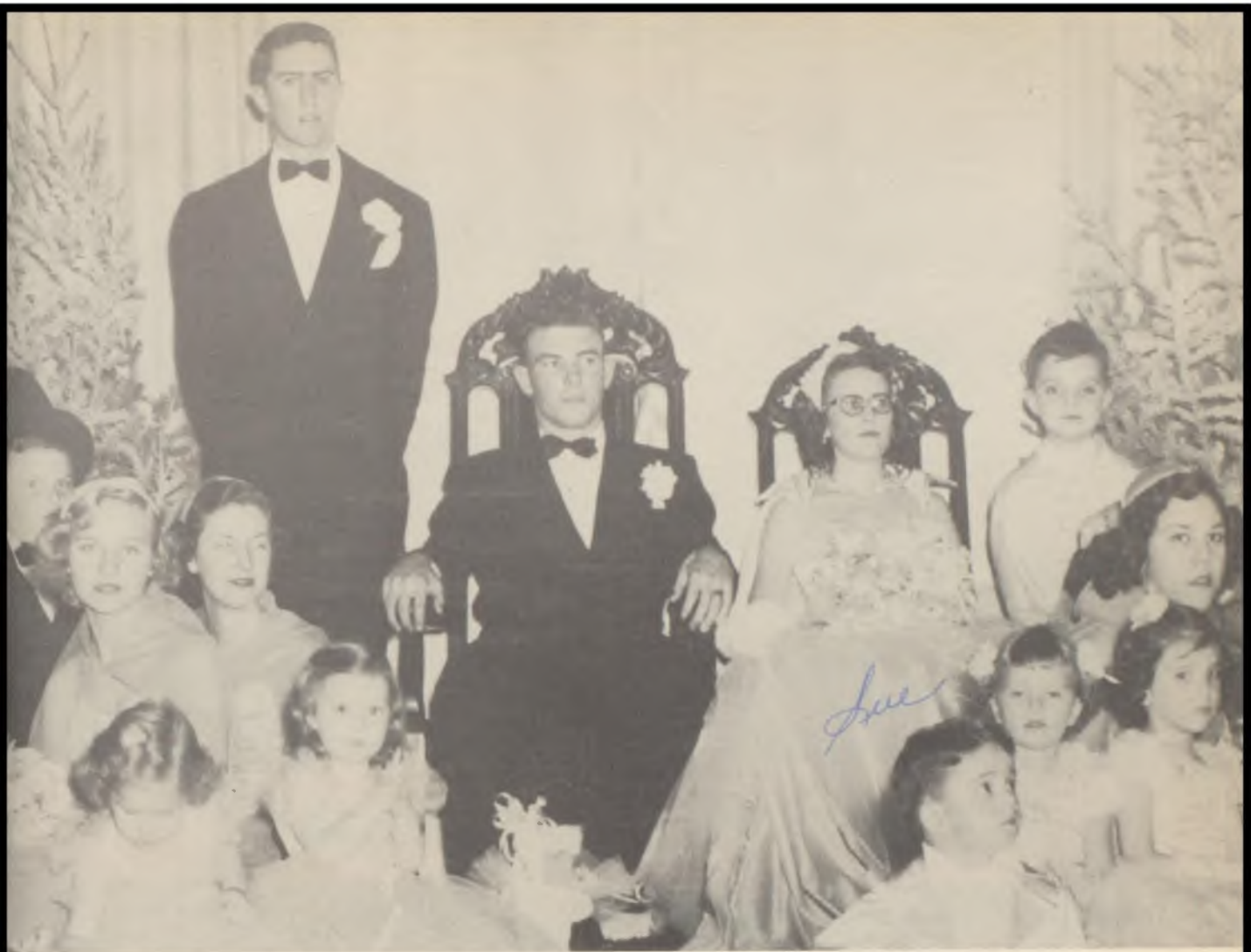

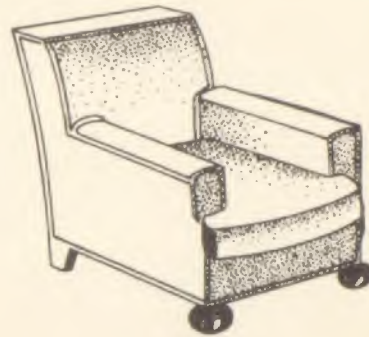
