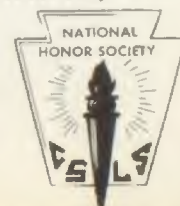

# THE STUDENT COUNCIL

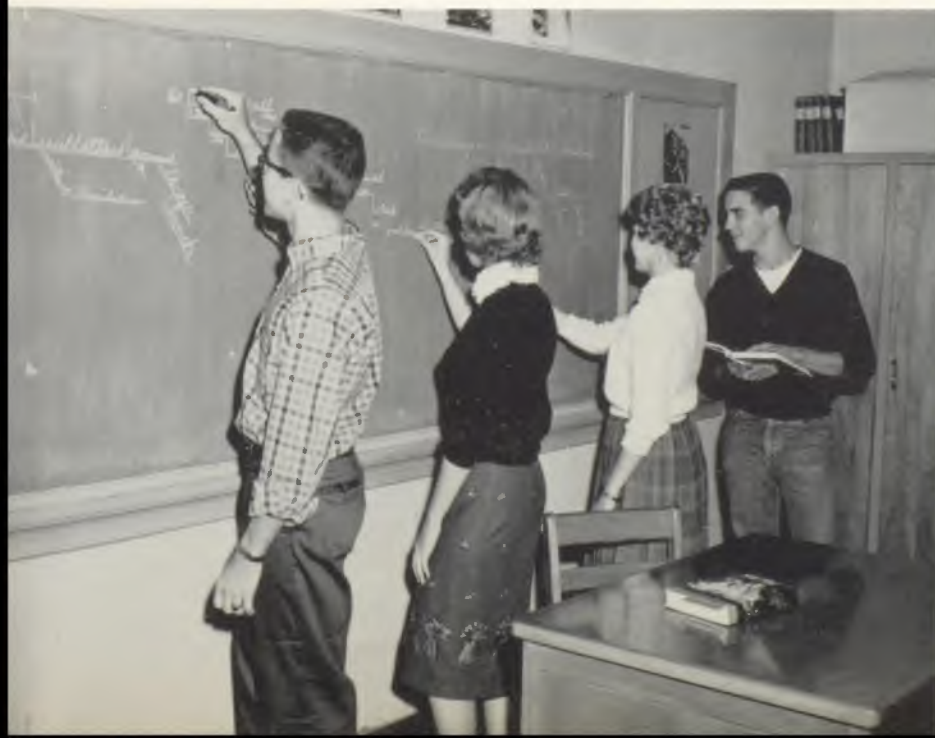

## HOMEMAKING

Homemaking education is centered on home activities and relationships which enable young people to assume the responsibilities of homemaking as family members today and later as they establish their own home. The basic goal of homemaking is to help the individual to live a useful and satisfying personal, family, and community life. In order to help students achieve satisfying home living, the following areas are taught in the three courses of homemaking offered in high school: clothing, feeding, and housing the family; family relationships; health, home care of the sick, and first aid; and child development.

The summer phase of the homemaking program is an extension of the regular school term in which youth have further opportunity to achieve their purposes. It offers further opportunity for the solution of home and family living problems in real, life-like situations in the home, school, and community.

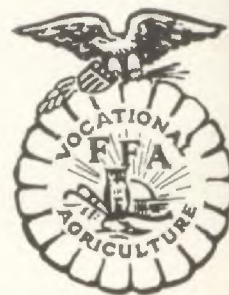




## VOCATIONAL AGRICULTURE

6. Make available gopher and rat poison in cooperation with The Texas Fish and Wild Life program.
7. Render service to farmers in setting out pines, building terraces and in other ways.
8. Each student will care for and develop a project of poultry, livestock and/or crops at home, supervised by the Vocational Agriculture teacher.
9. All students will complete some type of vocational agriculture shop project.
10. All students be members and participate in FFA meetings held at least once a month, in helping boys to become CLEAN honest leaders of Tomorrow.
11. Each student, if possible, to attend Dallas Fair.
12. Each student participate in at least one contest in leadership, livestock, dairy animals, crops, land use, land judging, electricity, grass judging.

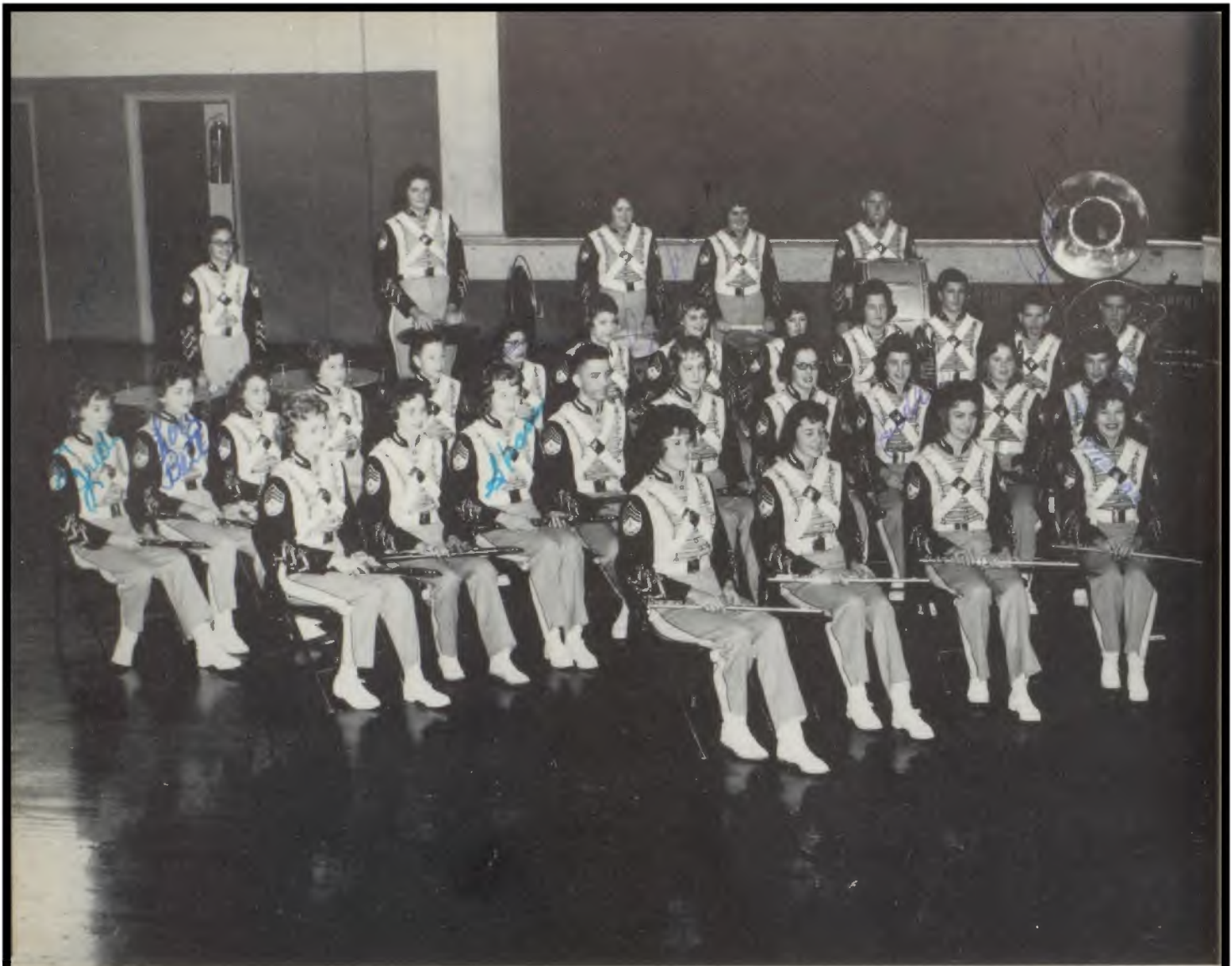

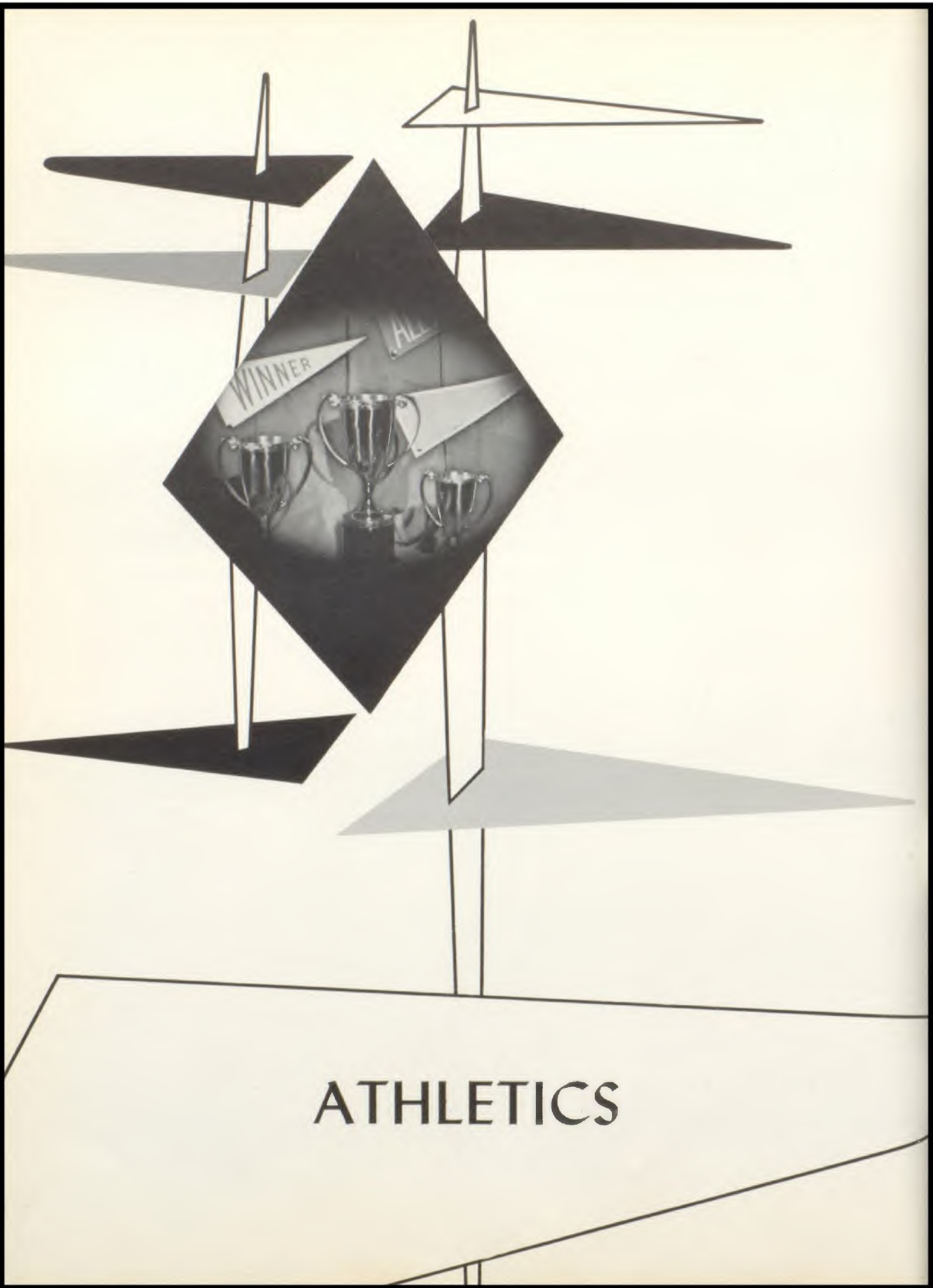

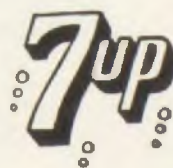
