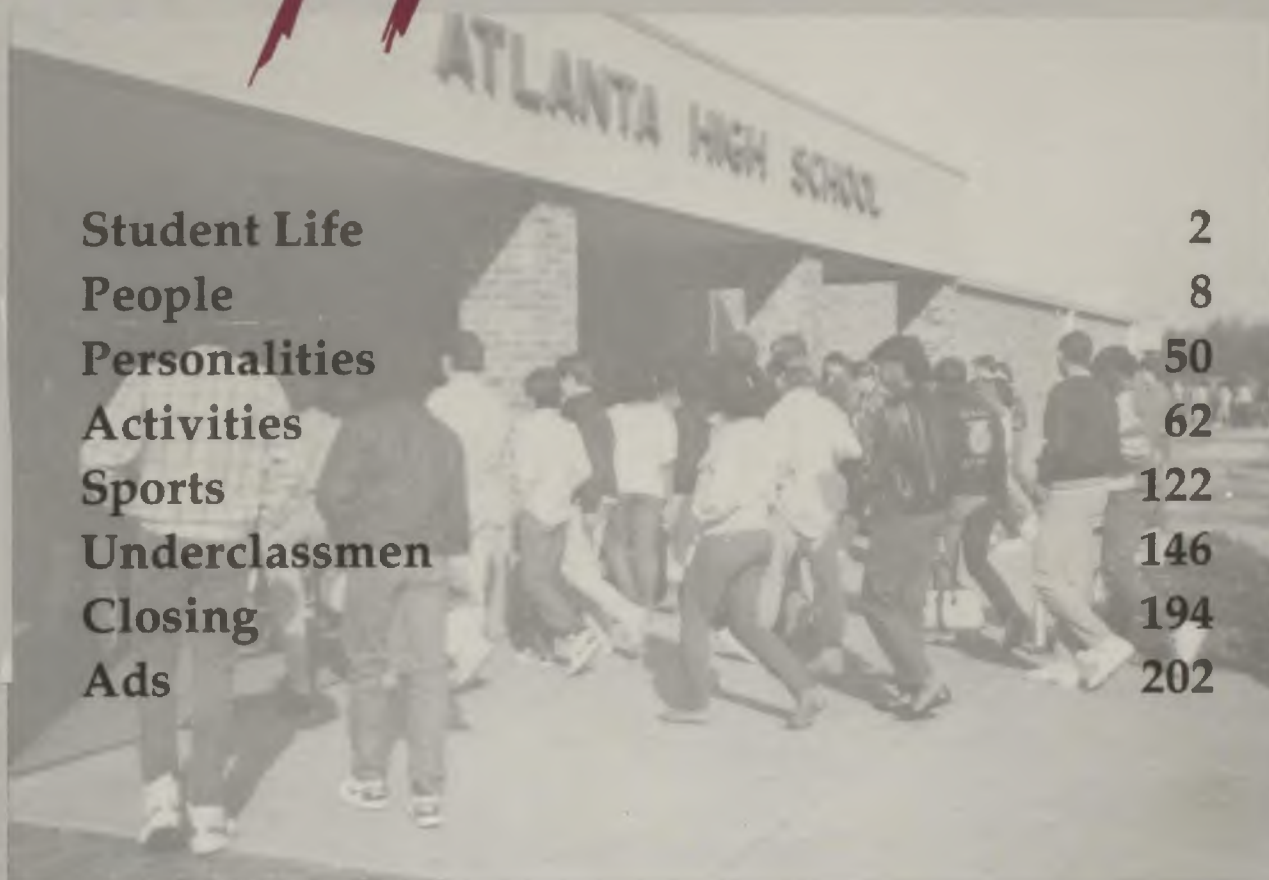

From the TECAT to the bond election, the administration was faced with many problems, according to Superintendent Dr. Walter Williams, but "they still ran an efficient operation."

"The major problem this year was complying with House Bill 72," Dr. Williams said. "Keeping a ratio of one teacher to twenty-two students was difficult because of lack of space."

The bond issue to eliminate this problem was not passed and Dr. Williams said they will have to deal with this somehow.

On the bright side, he said the schools were visited by the Texas Education Agency who evaluated their performance. Dr. Williams considers it a success that our accreditation remained the same and no corrective action was taken.

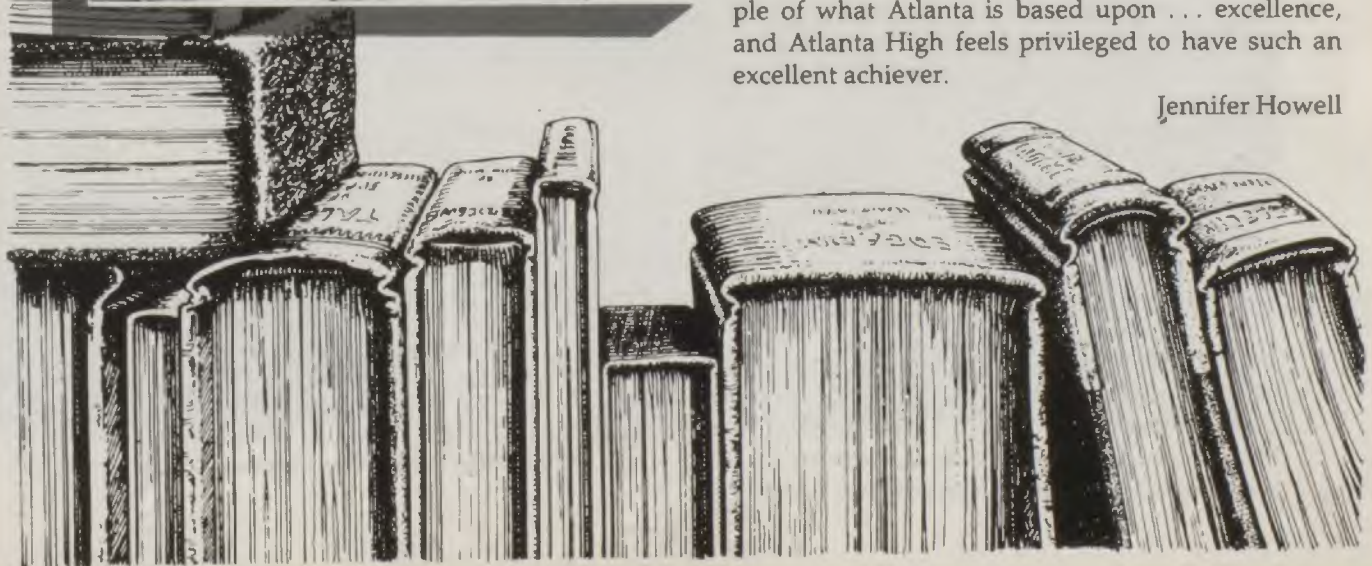

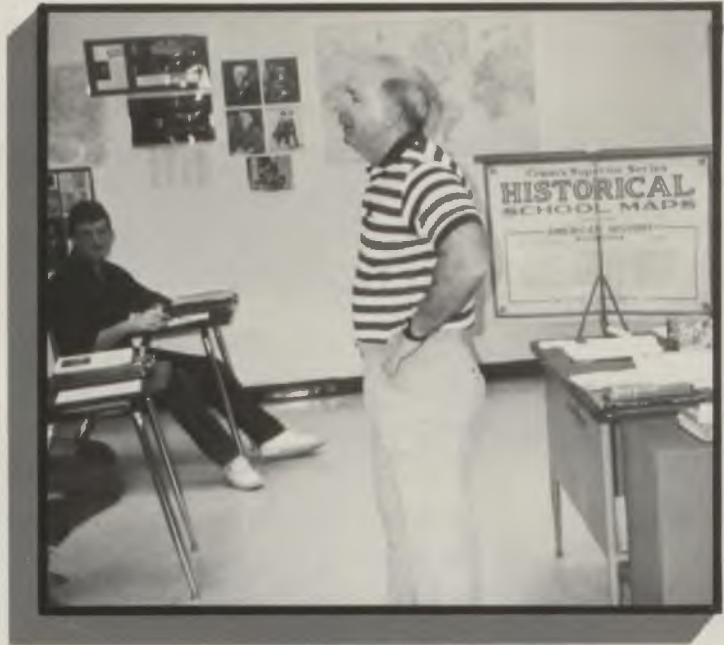


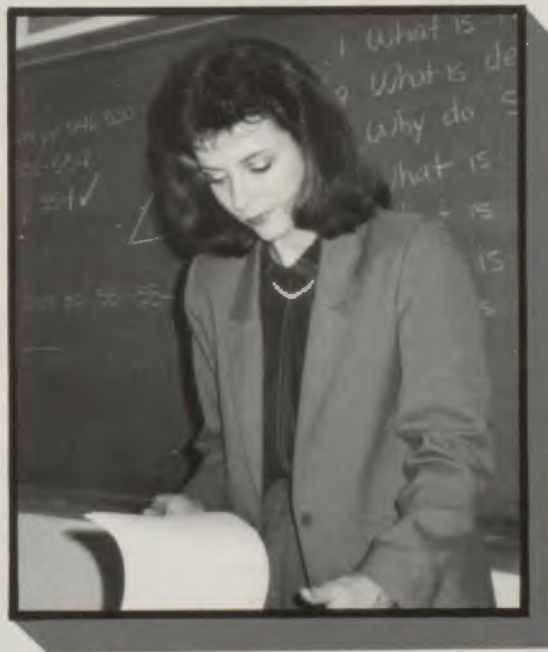
# SOCIAL STUDIES

He enjoys windsurfing, sailing, and squash.

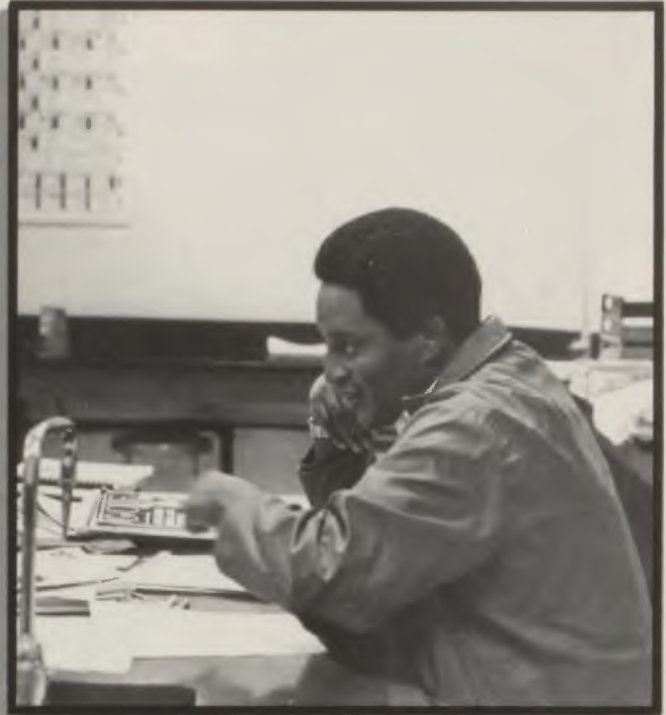

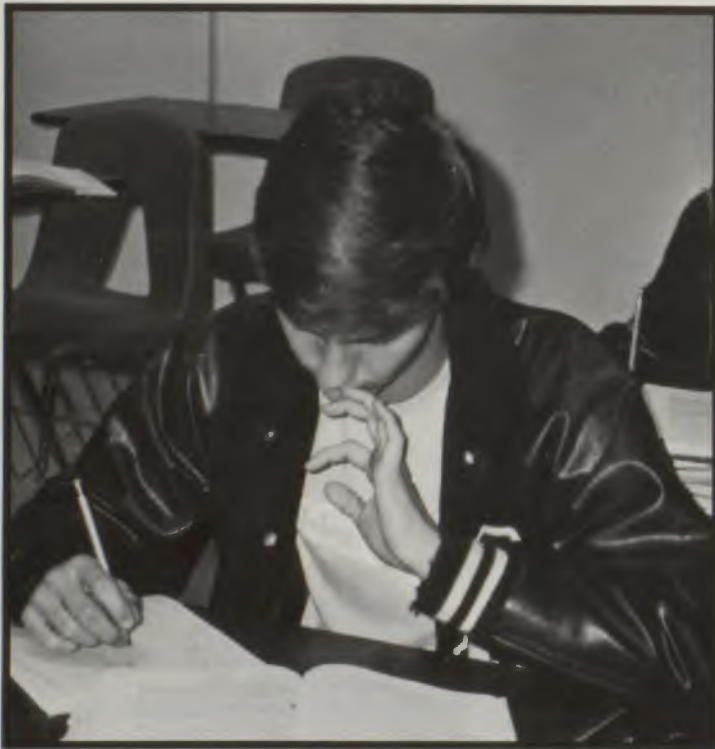

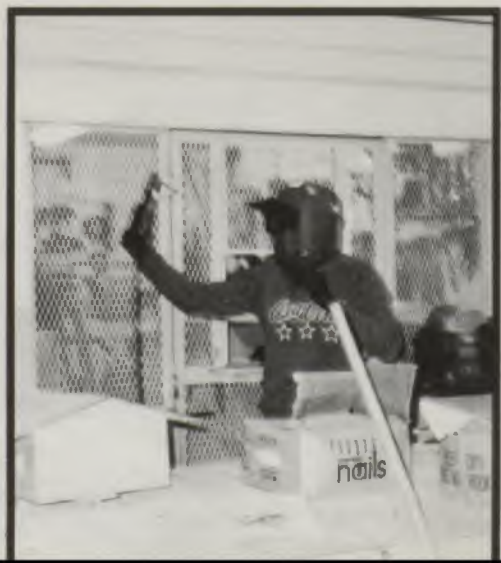

Both girls were active in their city-wide elections. Tia was elected mayor of City F, while Jana served as councilwoman of City J.

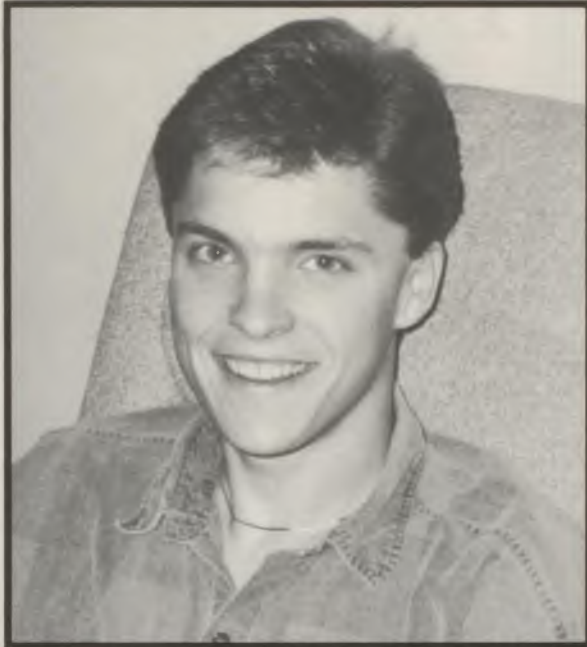
Although the girls were deprived of televisions, telephones, and radios, when asked if they would like to go back, both replied, "In a minute!"
