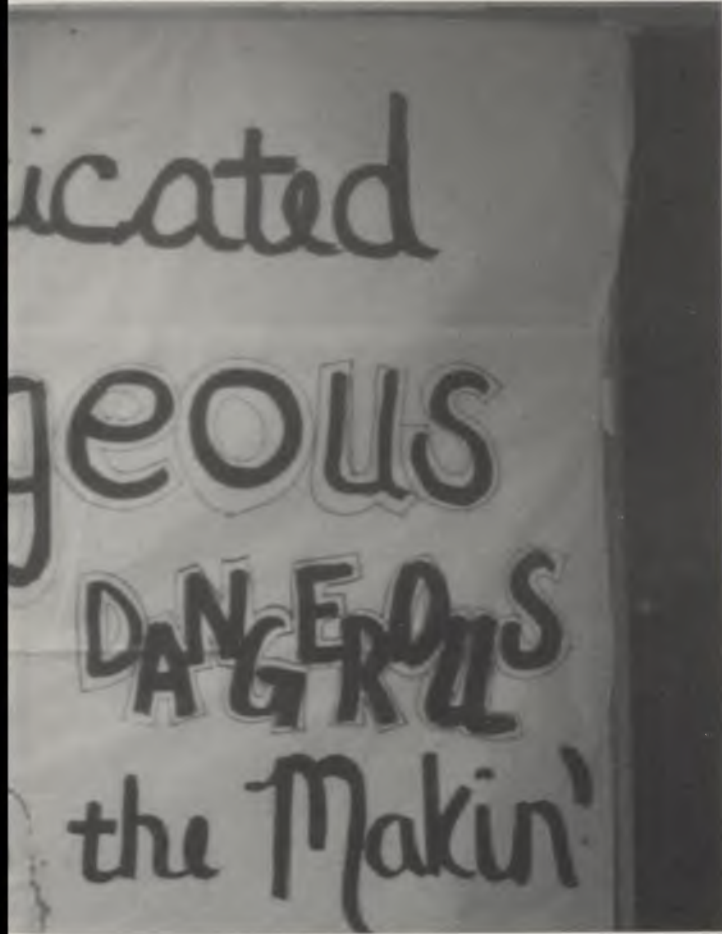

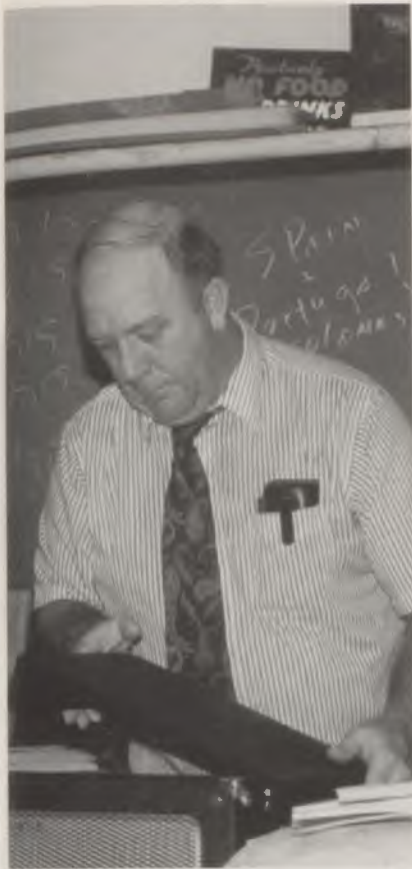

Let's Go Rabbits!

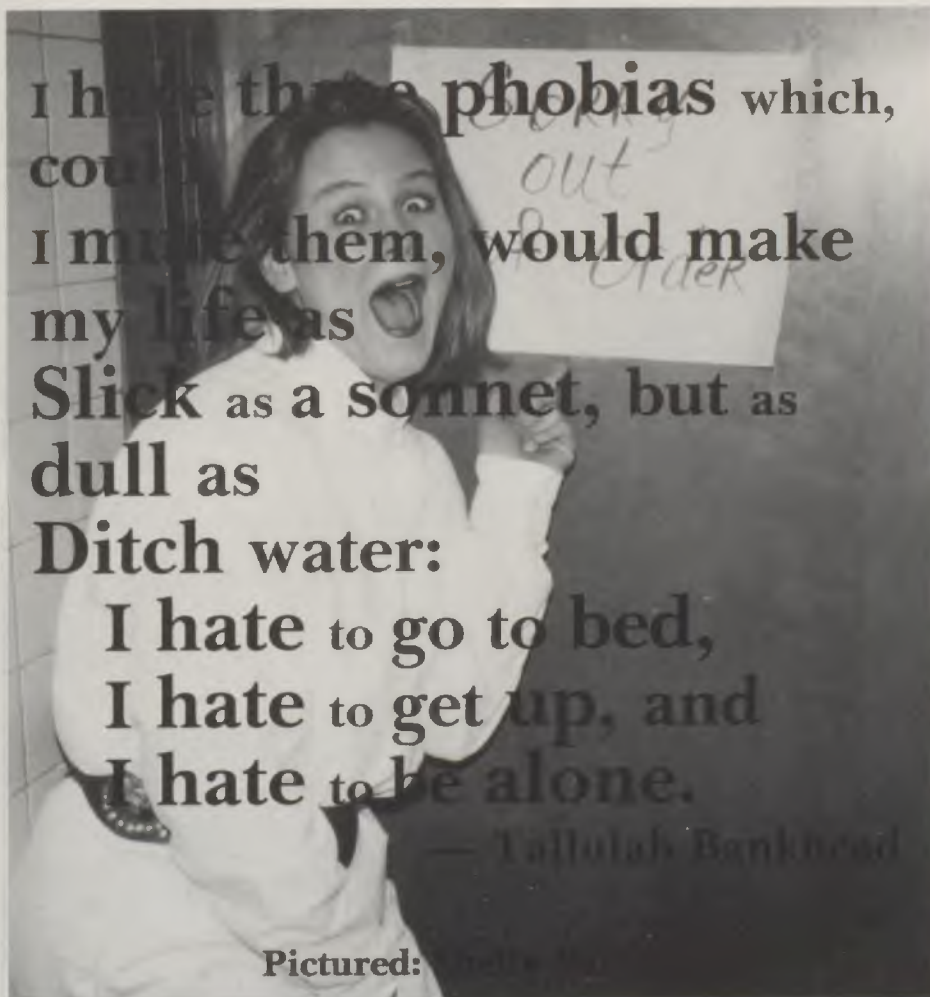

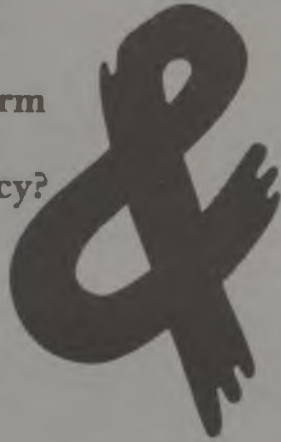

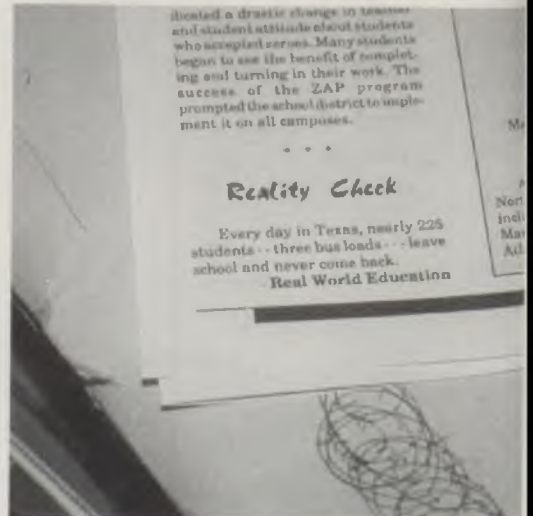

The AHS Times!?

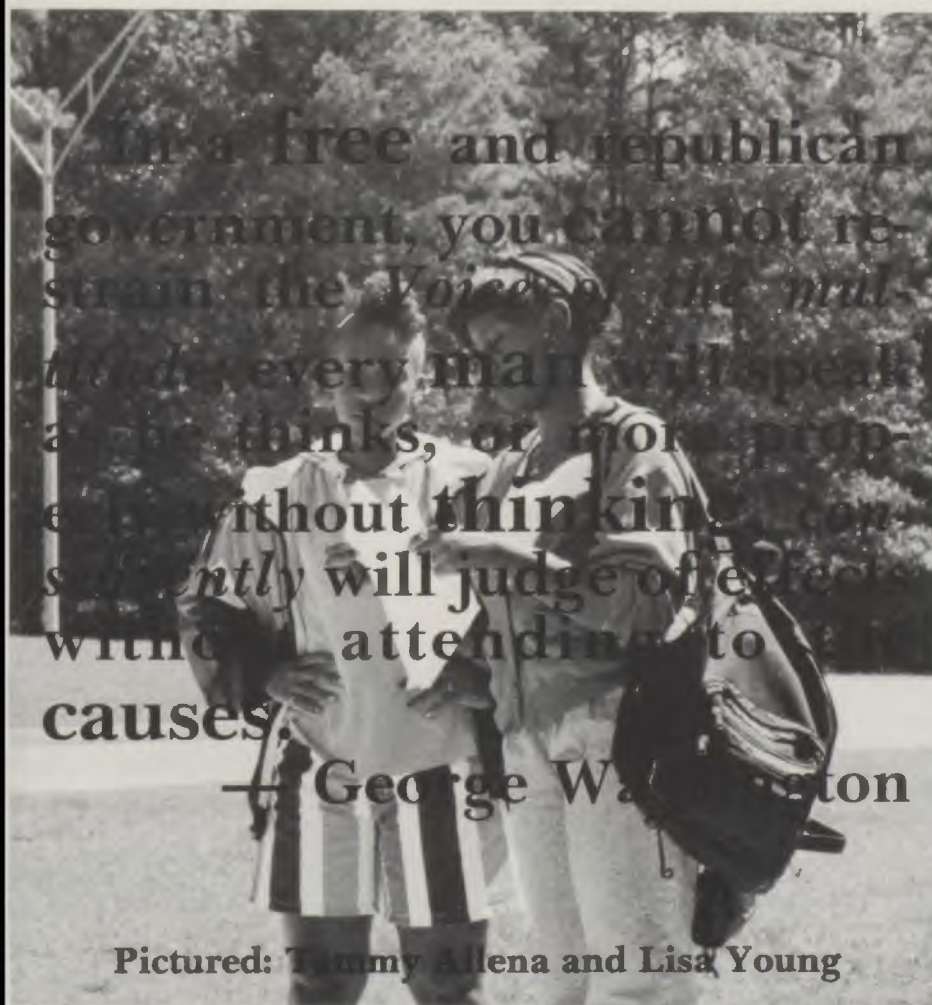
