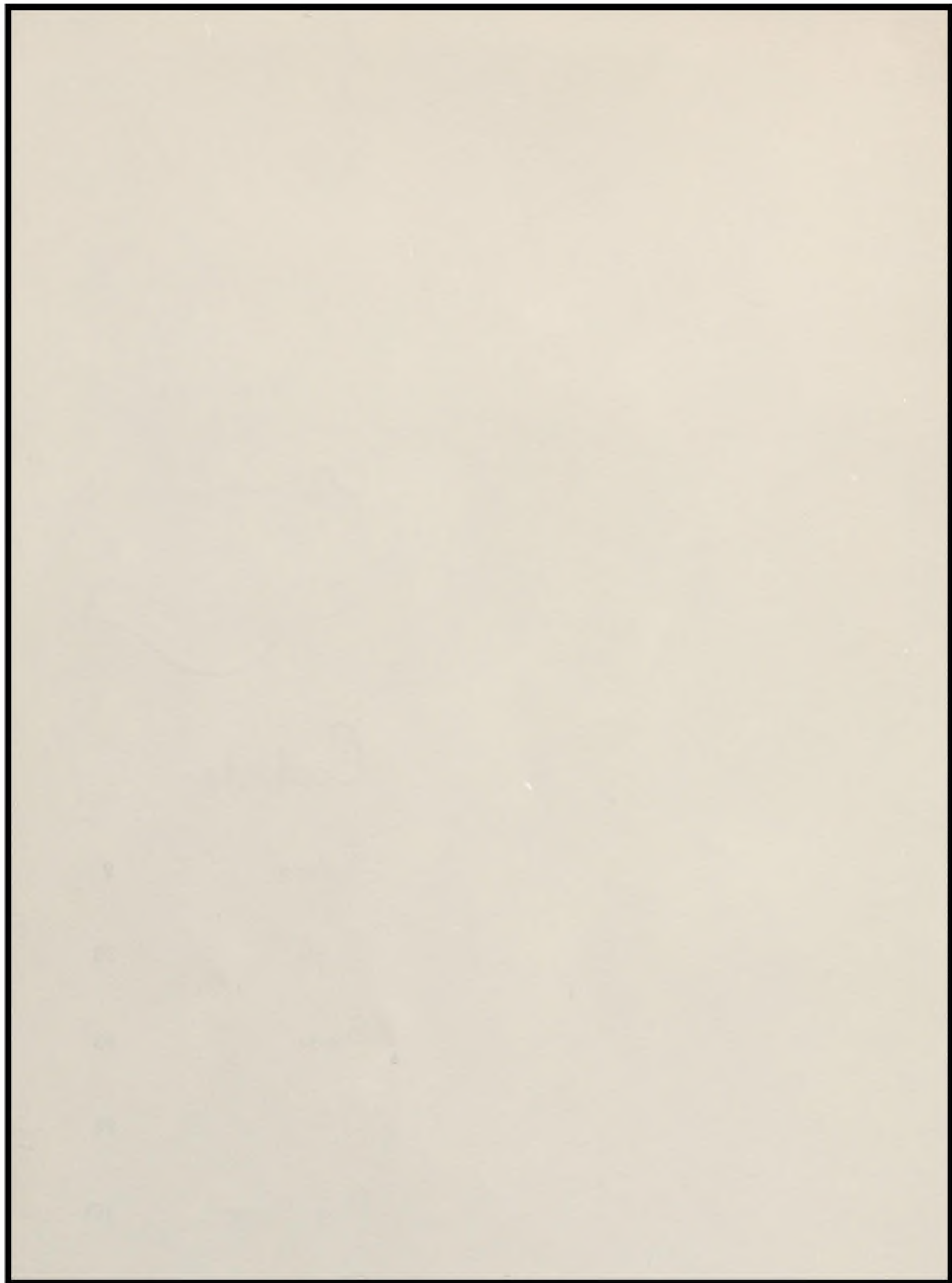

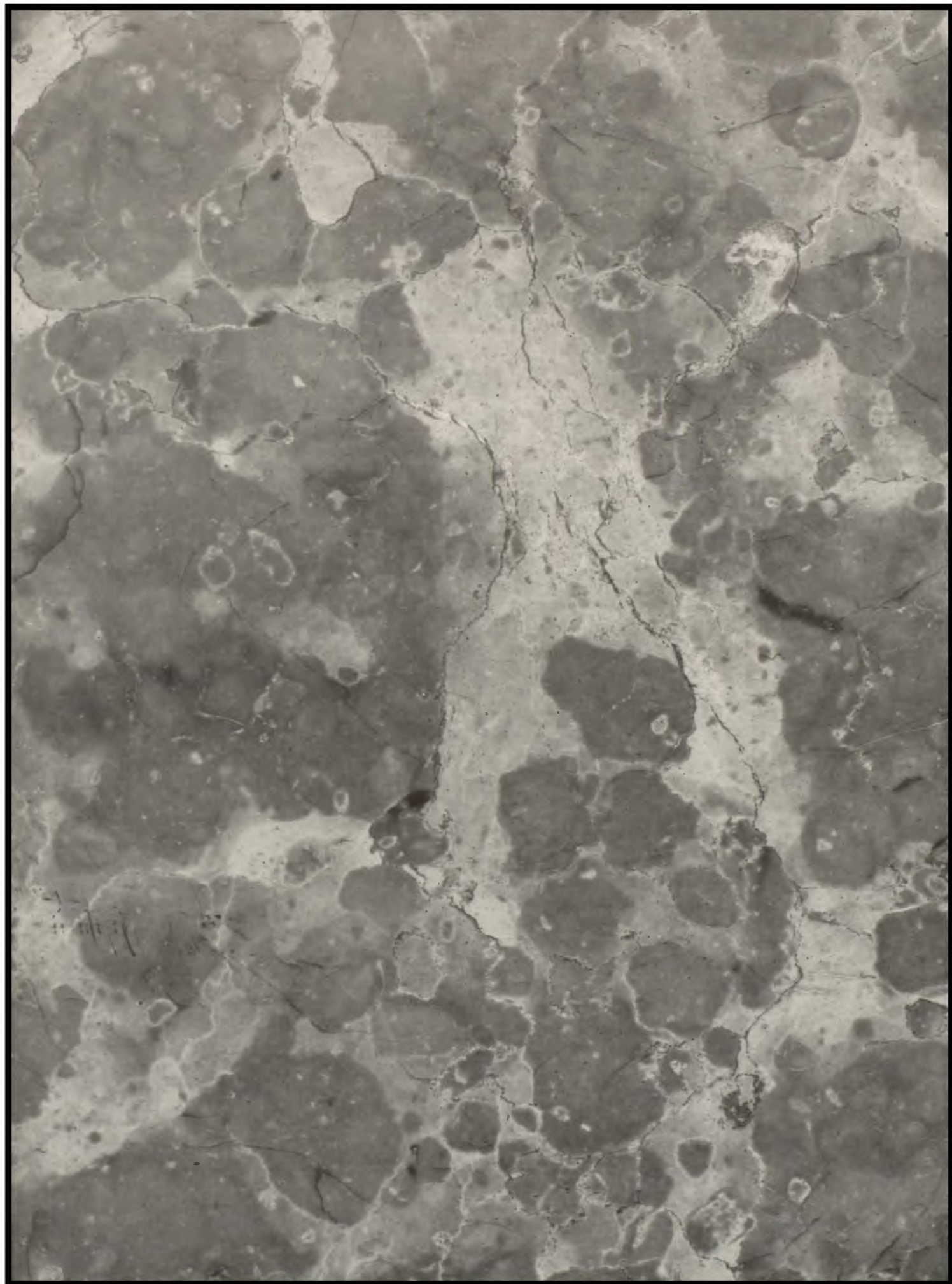

# Rabbs Bid Fond Adieu

## *Out With the Old, In With the New*

It was an emotional time for many Atlanta students and alumni. After 56 years, Bivins-Trice Stadium retired its grounds following various Homecoming festivities including a parade, a pep rally at the gazebo, and the annual crowning of the Homecoming King and Queen.

Bivins-Trice Stadium has been home to the Rabbits since 1938. At this time, oil was booming in the vicinity, and the school district's enrollment reached 833. The teaching faculty expanded to 29.

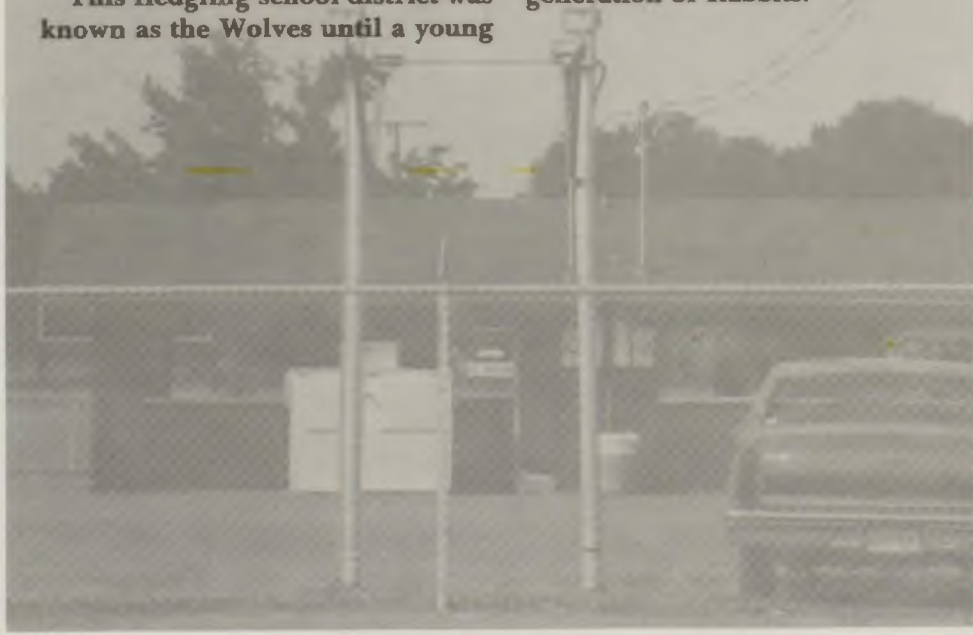
With the onset of an up-and-coming school district, Mrs. T. P. Price and her mother, Mrs. Frank Bivins, donated five acres of land which held the football field and field house. The school board then decided to add on to the area by purchasing additional acres which now house the Rabbit baseball field.

This fledgling school district was known as the Wolves until a young

war veteran and lawyer by the name of Ed Rabb moved to town. Under the influence of Rabb, who was a star athlete in college, the Wolves evolved into the Rabbits and became known in East Texas as a football powerhouse.

The stadium has been home to many great players. Some of these include John Barber, who completed a successful career with the NBA. Randy Jackson was a High School All-American who went on to play football with the Buffalo Bills, the San Francisco Forty-Niners, and the Philadelphia Eagles.

Although this is an emotional time for many Atlanta Rabbit fans, it is also a time for new beginnings and growth. New traditions will begin and foundations will be poured for the next generation of Rabbits.

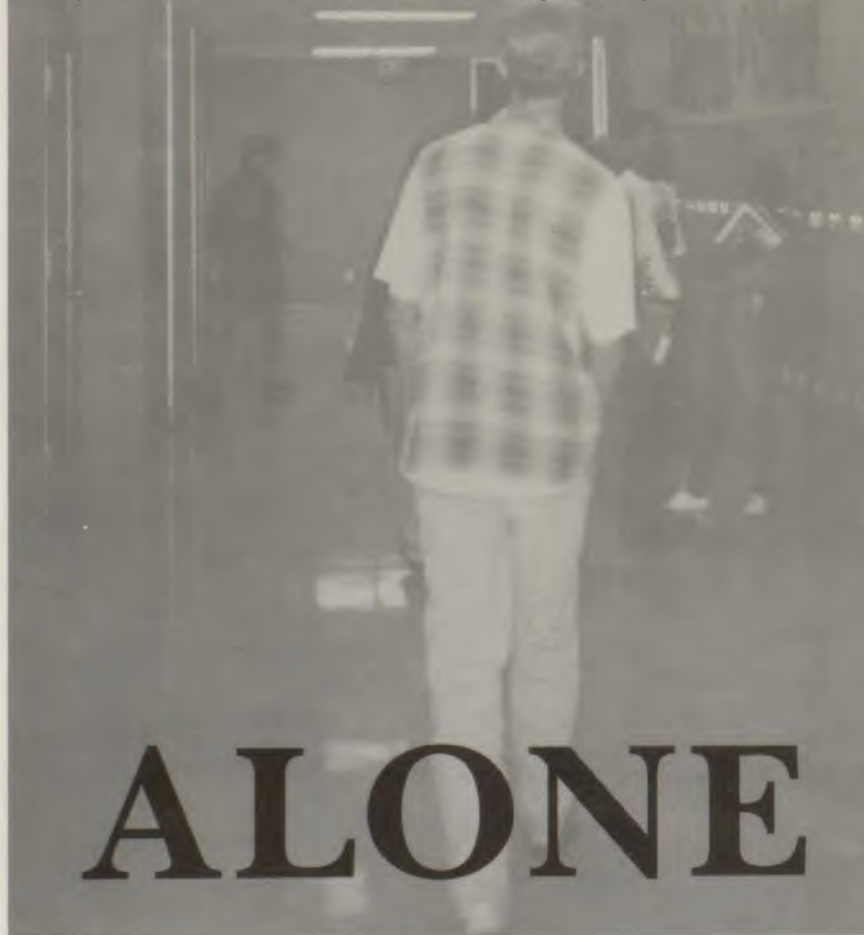

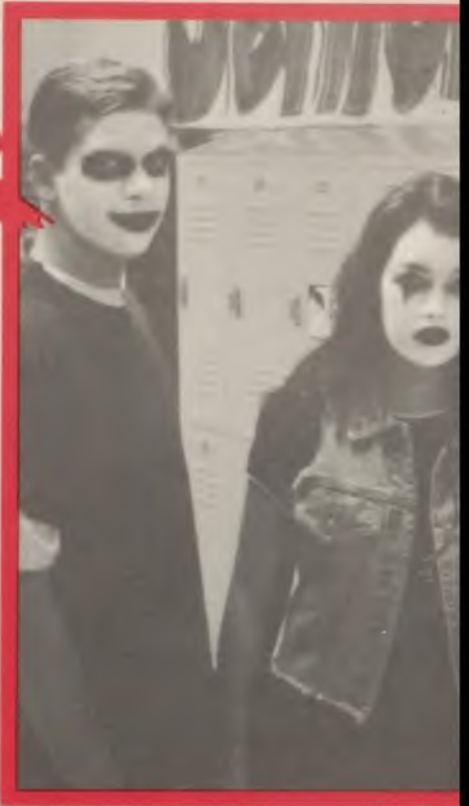


# THIS IS WAR

The week of war became known around Atlanta as Red Ribbon Week. Throughout the week, the army, consisting of students and staff, were all uniformed with red ribbons that stated, "1994 Drug-Free Begins With Me — Atlanta." Many of the battles we fought during the war were backed-up by our Allies: KALT/KPYN, International Paper, Brookshires, Food King, and other local businesses. 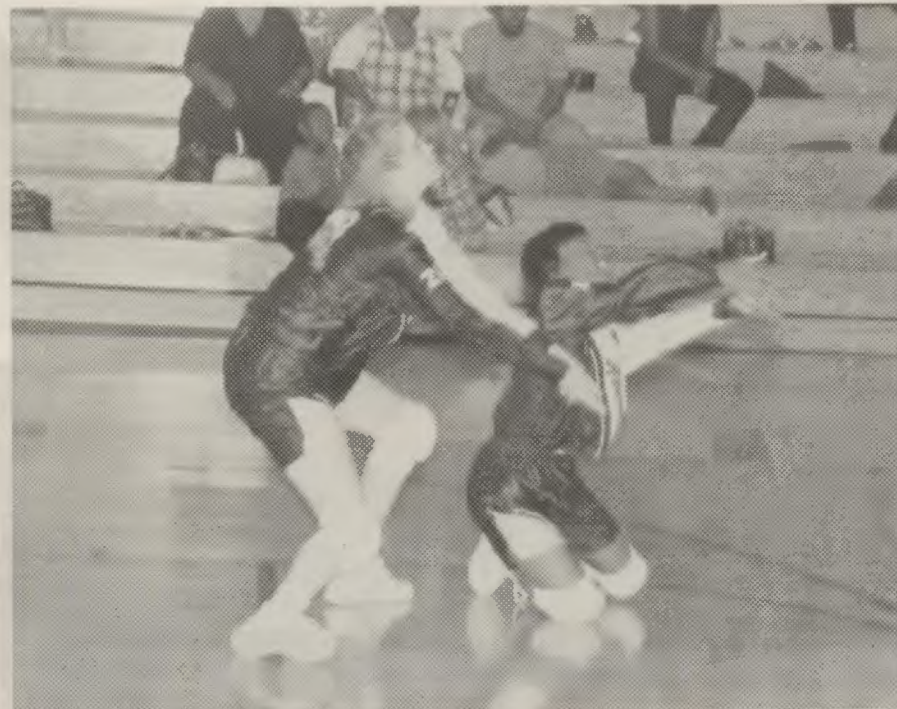

Hard work and dedication were two key phrases in Atlanta's vocabulary during the 1994 Football season. Warming up before a game was all a part of the work.

Teammates Randy Garner and Marwin Oliver sweat out yet another practice. Garner and Oliver were both on the starting team for the Rabbs.

Cheering the Rabbs to victory was the call of duty for these Varsity Cheerleaders. Come rain or come shine, they were on the field supporting the Rabbit players and fans.





## *Rivals Square Off*

Atlanta's first opponent in the 1994 playoff season was Cass County rival, Linden-Kildare. Everett Dickerson and Derrick Blaylock, who made his varsity debut against the Tigers, became the secret weapons for the maroon and white. The Rabbs lost the ball on the opening kickoff, but Mitch Savage managed to pin down the much-praised Lamont Zachery on the first down for no gain. Credit is most certainly due to Mikeil Justice who consistently broke through the line to district Love and downsize Zachery's running game. At the four-minute mark, Cody Melton set

up the play with an interception and put one more score on the board. The game at Lobo Stadium raised the Rabbits' record to 9-2.

In Gladewater, the Rabbs went on to face the Springhill Panthers. Atlanta dominated Springhill in every play. Blaylock racked up 174 yards and a touchdown on twenty carries. Rabbit quarterback, Kenneth Harrison, hit the 1500 yard mark with 184 passing yards. The quarterback found himself running for a touchdown of his own and throwing two bombshells to Jeff Fouche and Billy Oliver. Kicker, Adam

O'Kelley, hit all of his five point-after attempts. The Rabbs strolled 94 yards in just nine running plays for the resulting score of 41-19.

The third game against Gainesville was said to be the Rabbits' last. After all, Atlanta was still not ranked and the Leopards held fifth in some state polls. Harrison set the mood from the beginning as he sought out Kacy Kidd with a 56 yard scoring bomb. Cale Melton and Billy Oliver caught two touchdown passes to light up the scoreboard in Carrollton. Gainesville's six points were no match for Atlanta's 41.

Down 15 points at halftime to their unbeaten rival, Jefferson, the Atlanta Rabbits kicked and clawed to gain ground. With 1:52 left in the game, the Rabbs were still behind and were conveniently at their own 26-yard line. Quarterback Ken Harrison rolled left on a naked

bootleg and threw the ball toward the utmost corner of the field. Billy Oliver, junior wide receiver, exploded out of a mob of Bulldogs, reached out, cradled the ball, and dove into the end zone to score the winning touchdown.

Down by 5 with 38 seconds left, Billy Oliver caught the ball and kept the playoff dream alive.







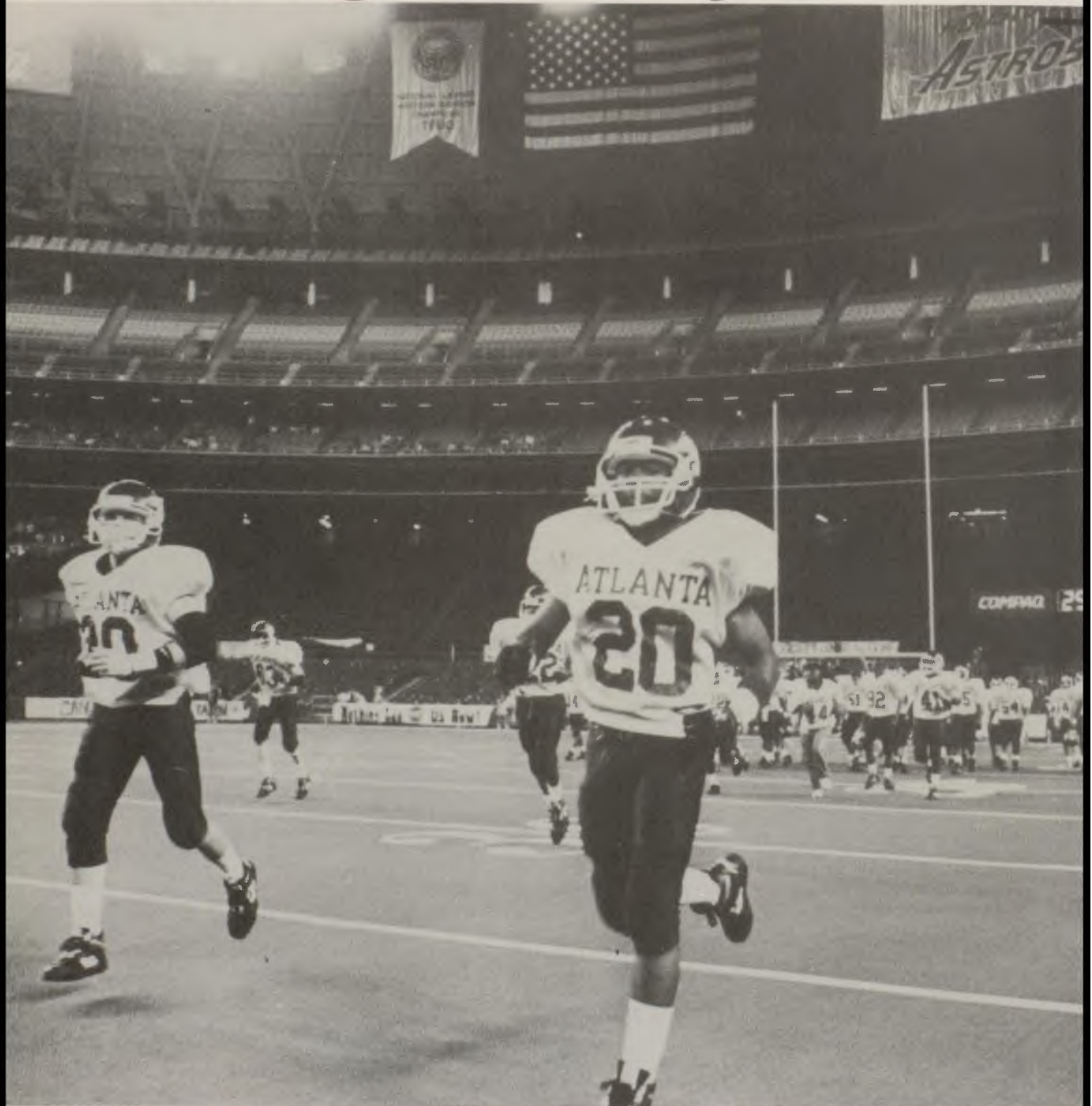


## *Just Another Pit Stop*
