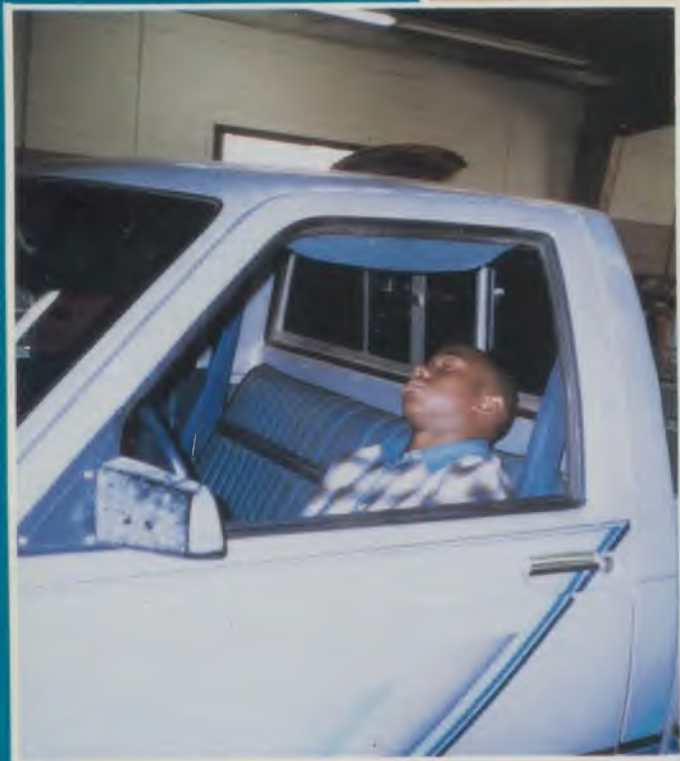
Most Spirited

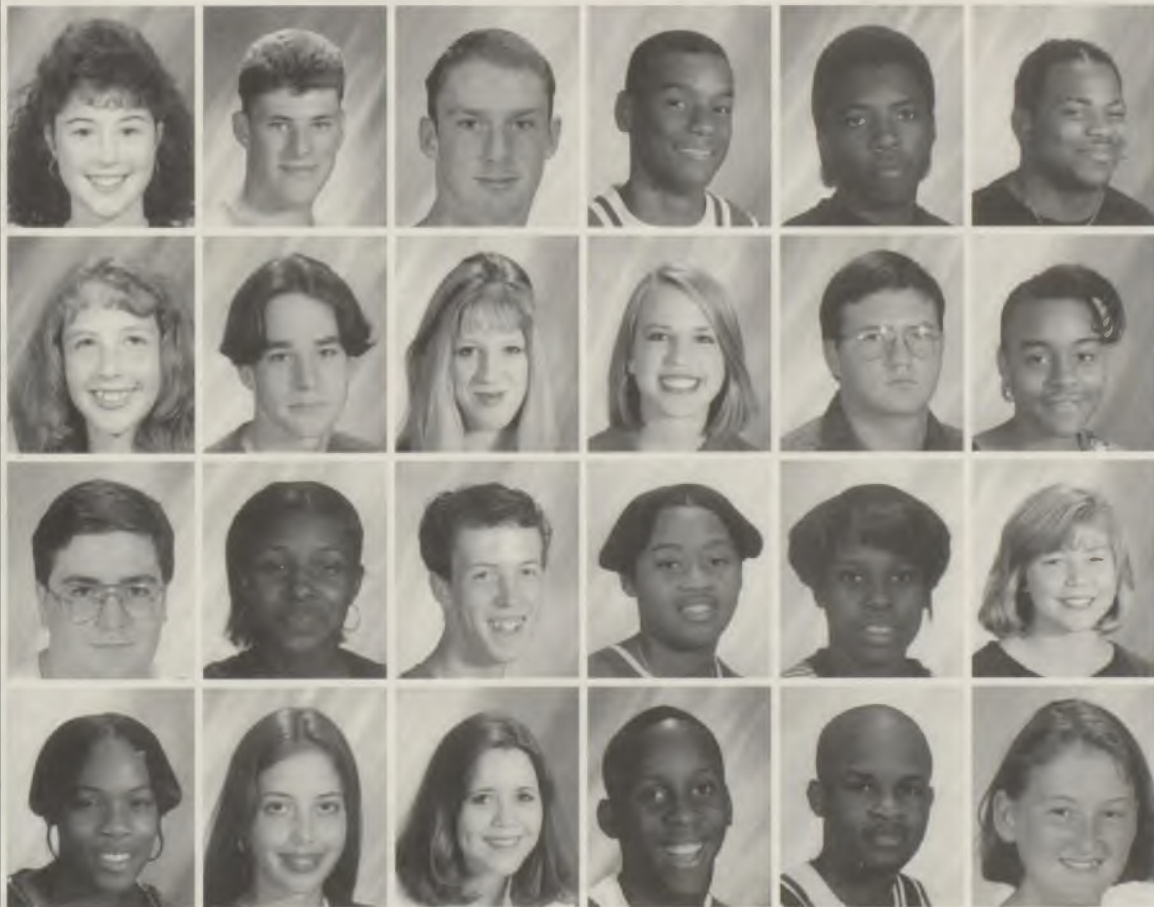

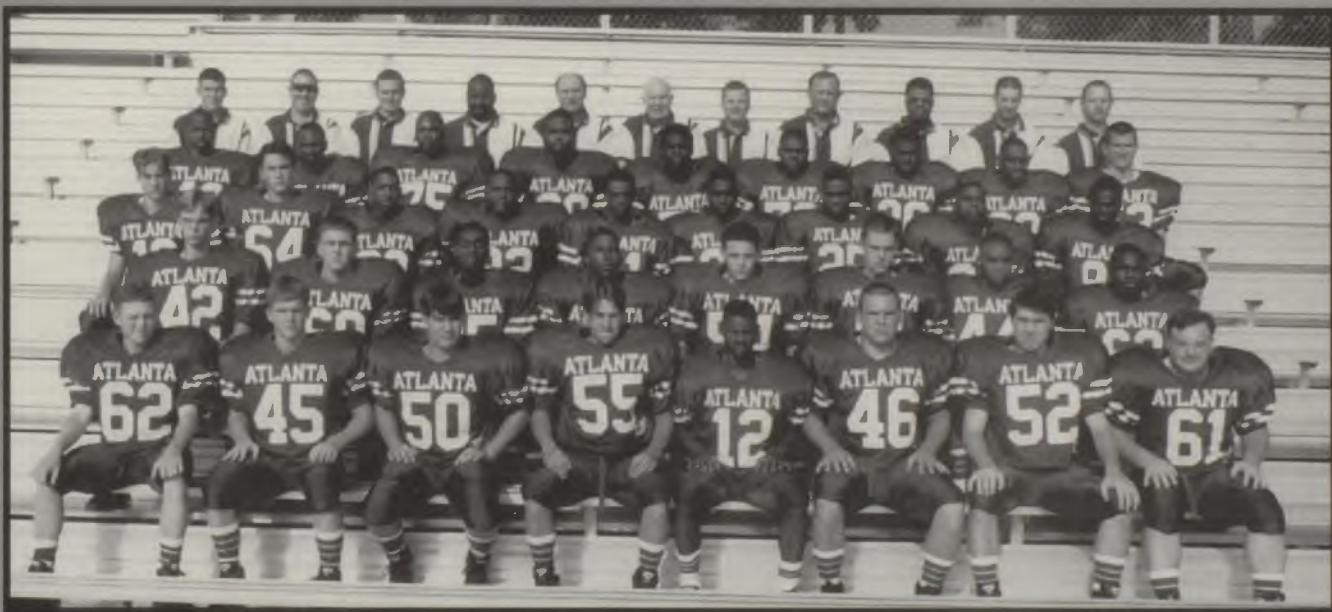

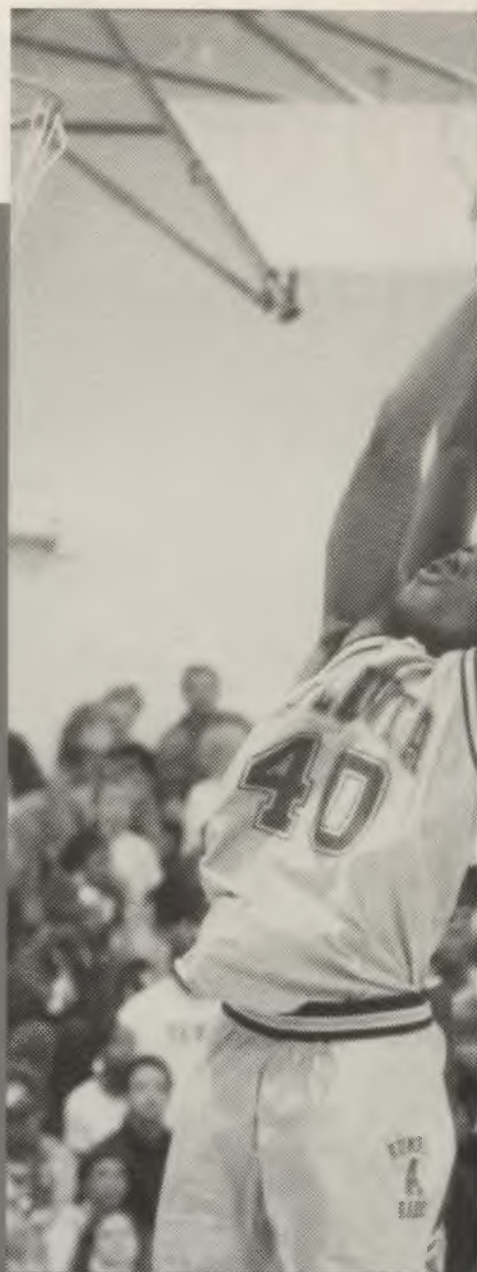
Varsity hoopsters continue to dominate

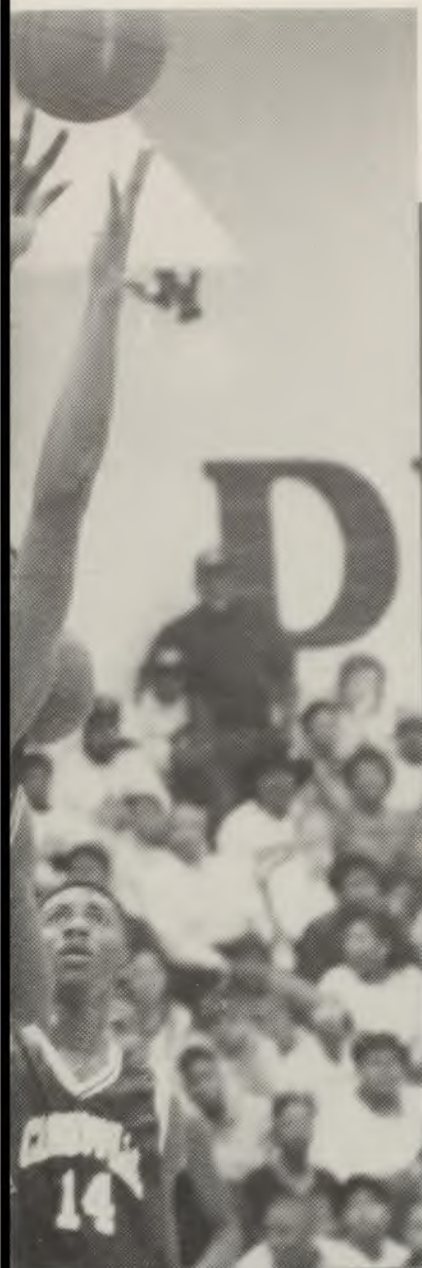

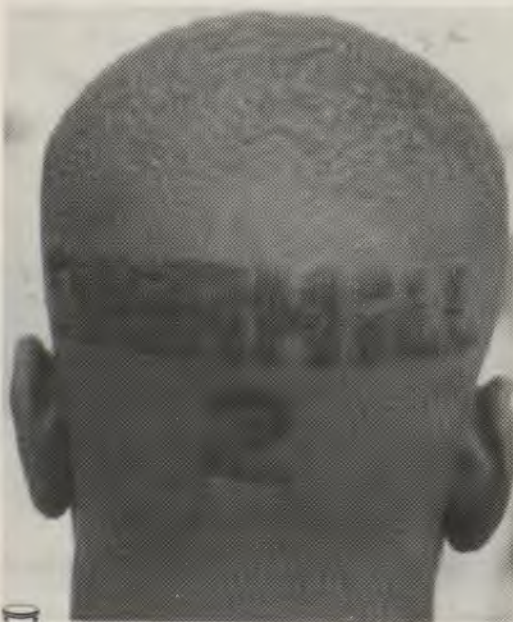
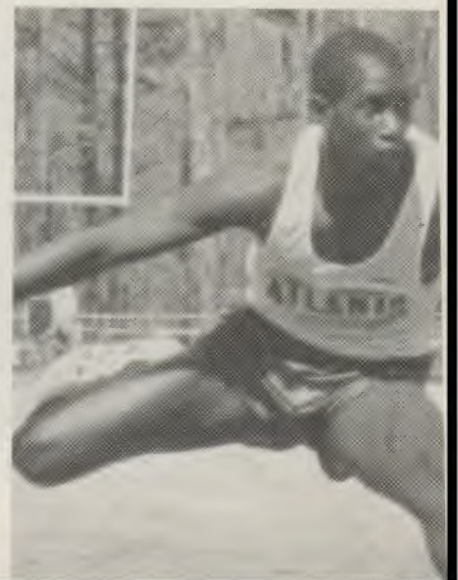


AGAINST THE CLOCK
