#### A Message from our Superintendent




So often we are by our school days and school opportunities as we are by our friends, that is, we do not fully appreciate them until they are gone.

# a brief history of the Senior Class


That beautiful, sunny morning in September 1943, was just like any other opening day of school. The assembly hall was filled -- with dignified Seniors, haughty Juniors, sophisticated Sophomores, and 55 bewildered Freshmen. But the mysteries of painful initiations, room numbers, locker numbers, and "Why can't I have that class that period?" were soon solved and those Freshmen settled back in their desks full-fledged high school students. In many ways this Senior Class was like any other Senior Class. Its members never studied too hard but always enough to make the grade; they had the regular round of parties and dances -- probably more than many Senior Classes; they took part in every activity of the school at large, at times by their efforts making successes of failures; and even though they didn't like everything about it always defended good old Linden High; they had the same class officers as any other class and conducted business in much the same way -- with probably a little more noise of yeas and nays than was necessary. These officers were: Presidents: Jewel Daughety, Freshman year; Merry Ruth Wood, Sophomore year; Franklyn Hamilton, Junior year; and Edward Stanford, Senior year. Thomas George had the rare honor of being Vice-President every year. Secretaries were Martha Whitenberg, Frances Wells, Jane Harris and Merry Ruth Wood.

But there was something that made this Senior Class different from other Senior Classes. For one thing fully 25% of its members were "A" students, 75% "B" or above. Too, it was always "on the ball"--up-to-date in everything it planned and did. However, the thing that made this Senior Class different from others was probably this: From September 1943, when it was the Freshman Class until today, it has always been known and praised for its friendliness--the friendly attitude of its members toward fellow-students, toward school work and toward class business.

Of the 55 students who enrolled as Freshmen in 1943, 33 have completed four years of work. Five students have transferred from other schools to Linden, and two young men this year returned from the service to complete their high school work, making the total who will graduate in May, 40. Of the 22 who didn't make it nine boys went into the service, three girls married, seven students moved from Linden, one fell behind because of prolonged illness, one is unaccounted for, and one died.

Doubtless in the future Linden and other towns and cities will progress upward as a result of the influence and work of these 40 students--the Senior Class of Linden High School--1947.

The next ten pages of "Tiger Tracks" contain the pictures of these 40 Seniors. Beside each Senior is a list showing his nickname, birth date, ambition, and favorite song.

This program has proven very effective due to the practical manner in which it has been operated.


