Tigers get ready for Lions

The New Boston Lions turned back a stubborn Linden team 6-0 in a game that was a scoreless duel until early in the 4th quarter when Lion halfback Gibson, on a punt return, raced 50 yards for a touchdown. The Tigers posed as a threat only once as they drove to the 14 yard line early in the third period. Outstanding for the Tigers on defense were: Hines, Hargett, Fitts, and Anderson.

With a new found offense equally as good as their strong defense, Linden rolled over Jefferson by a convincing margin of 19-6. The Tigers started a drive in the 1st quarter that paid off when Q.B. Hines sneaked over from the 3 yard line. This drive started on the Tigers' 40 yard line - with huge fullback Fitts slicing off tackle time and again for gains of 6 to 15 yards. The Tigers then kicked to the Bulldogs who, after being held for downs, were forced to punt. Hargett picked up the punt on his own 8 yard line and under cover of beautiful blocking raced 92 yards for the second score. Linden's final score came on a pass from Hines, who hit Hargett in the end-zone.

After playing on even terms for the first quarter, Tiger tackle Bobby Wood picked up a fumble on Hughes Springs' 25 yard line, and immediately Linden capitalized as Q.B. Hines plunged over from the 7 yard line. The half ended 6-0. In the second half the Tigers went on a scoring spree that seemed to have no end as Hines scored from 4 yards, Fitts from 5 yards, Hargett once from the 12 yard line and then on a 45 yard pass from Q.B. Hines. While the Tiger offense was great, the whole team was also excellent.






The Linden Tigers took the opening kick-off and drove the Clarksville 22 yard line where they lost the ball on a fumble. This first drive was an example of the playing that was to be seen that night as each team time and again threatened, but neither could muster enough scoring punch to carry them over the double stripe. Late in the fourth quarter Linden seemed to find the scoring punch it had been looking for all night as Hargett broke loose on two long runs. The final whistle found them one yard short of paydirt.

The educated toe of Dwayne Anderson spelled the difference between victory and defeat for Linden against Paul Pewitt as he kicked two extra points and a field goal. With the score tied 14-14 and less than one minute to play in the game, Anderson booted an 18 yard field goal. Pat Griffin had scored first for the Tigers in the second quarter after Hines had intercepted a pass on the Brahmas' 35 yard line. Hargett and Fitts tore the Pewitt line to shreads with power drives which resulted in the Tigers' second tally.



After Hooks went ahead on a pass play, the Tigers carried to the Hooks 20 yard line only to loose the ball on a penalty. The game ended with the Tigers in possession of the ball deep in Homet territory.

Outstanding for Linden were: Williams, Swinford, Smith, Washington, Hines, Hargett, and Fitts.

Linden outplayed Atlanta all over the field and would have won the game had it not been for 5 Atlanta plays. Playing with the determination "that if you won't be beat, you can't be beat" Linden played as great a game as East Texas has ever seen. Playing as a team with no stars, the Tigers fought to a 25-25 tie with 3 minutes to play only to see Atlanta run the kick-off back 90 yards for the winning touchdown. After a heart-breaking defeat all Linden had to say was, "Wait until next year."


