


We are especially grateful to the Pep Squad for their donation to the Annual Fund. Their donation made it possible to have a larger Annual, one that I know we will all be proud of.



Juanita Parker is now coaching girl's basketball at Centenary College at Shreveport.


Bobby Ray Forbes has really grown up in ten years. He is now the world's heavyweight wrestler and holds the title to the Golden Belt.

Casey Wall is another "Rambo" expert.


Wonder what business Charles Gryder and Paul Liles had in Houston the day of our last game?

We are looking forward to a better and stronger team next year and we'll show the coach just how good we really are.








Football King and Queen




