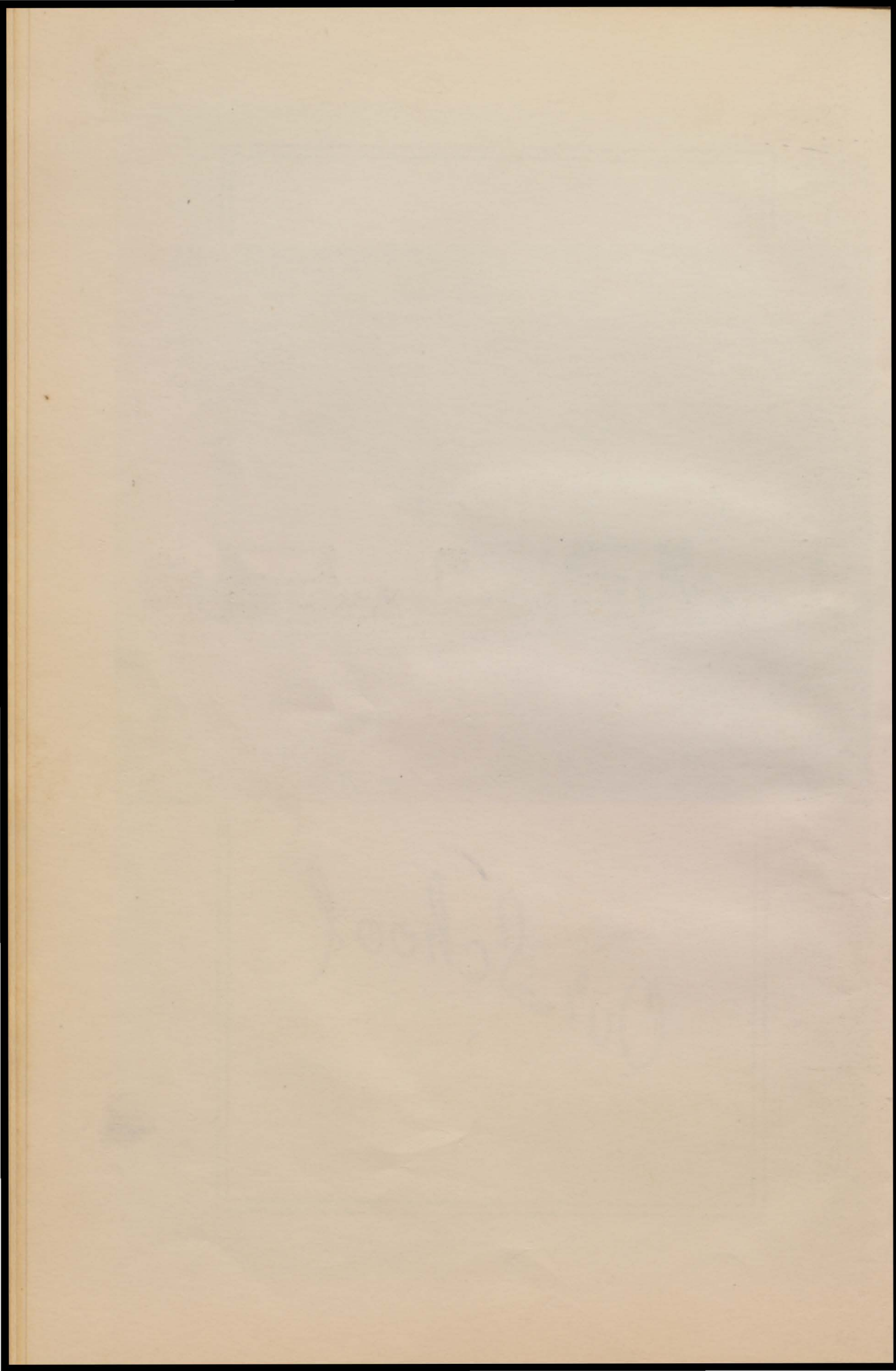


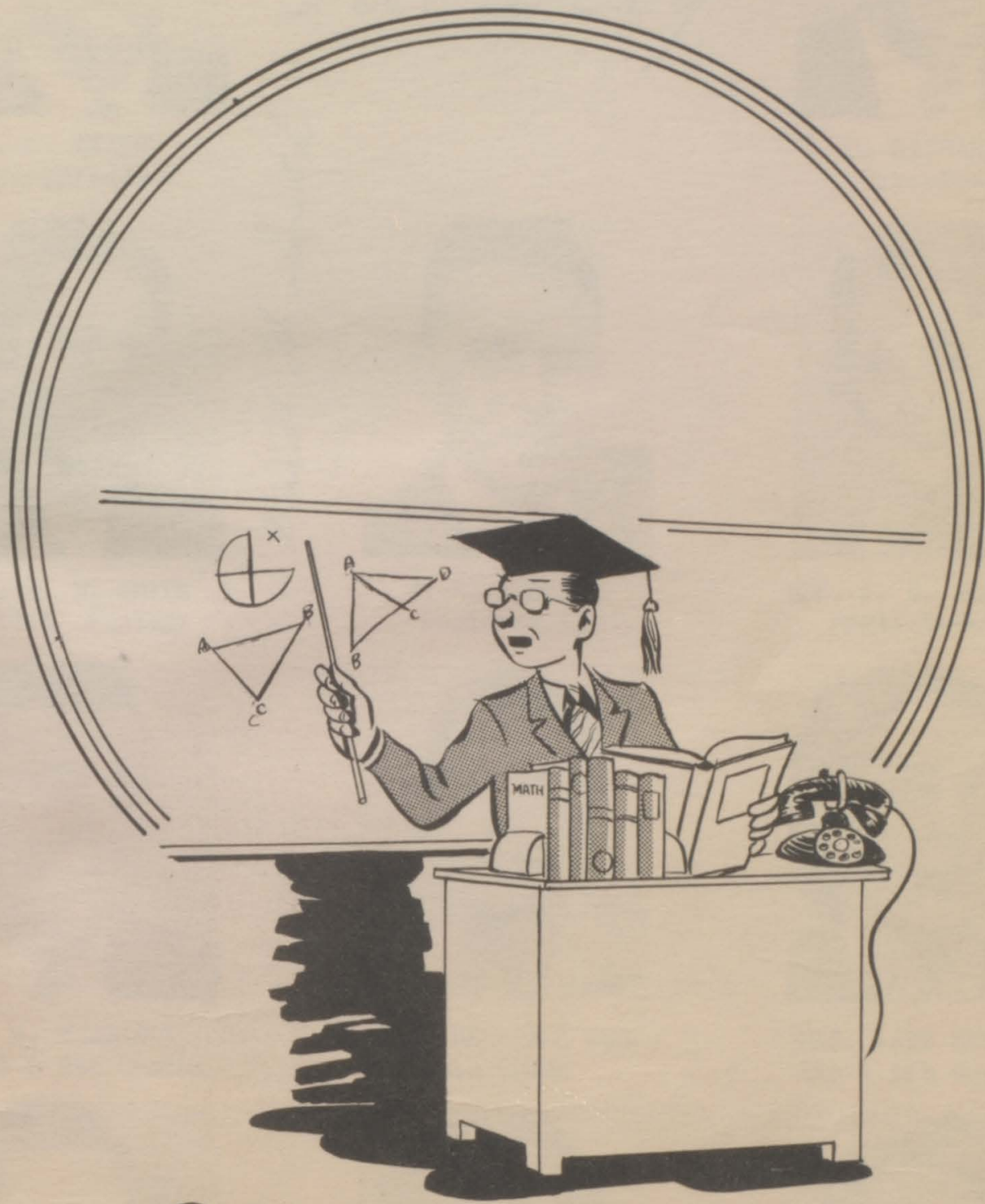
Foreword
