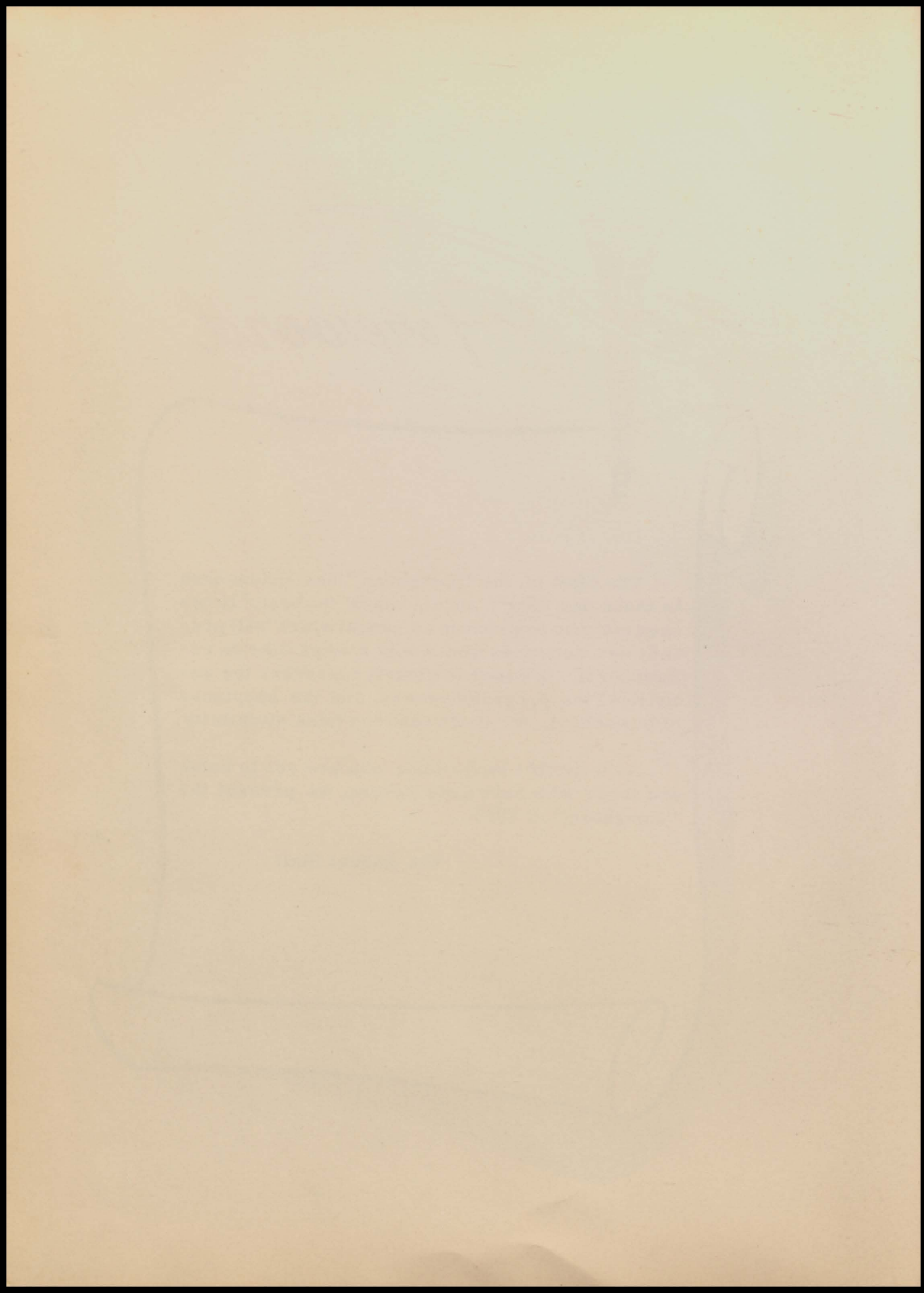
# Foreword

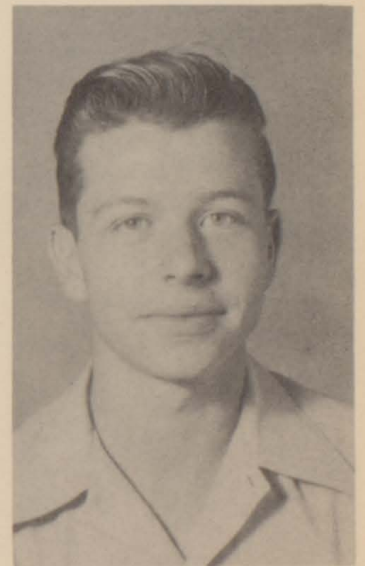


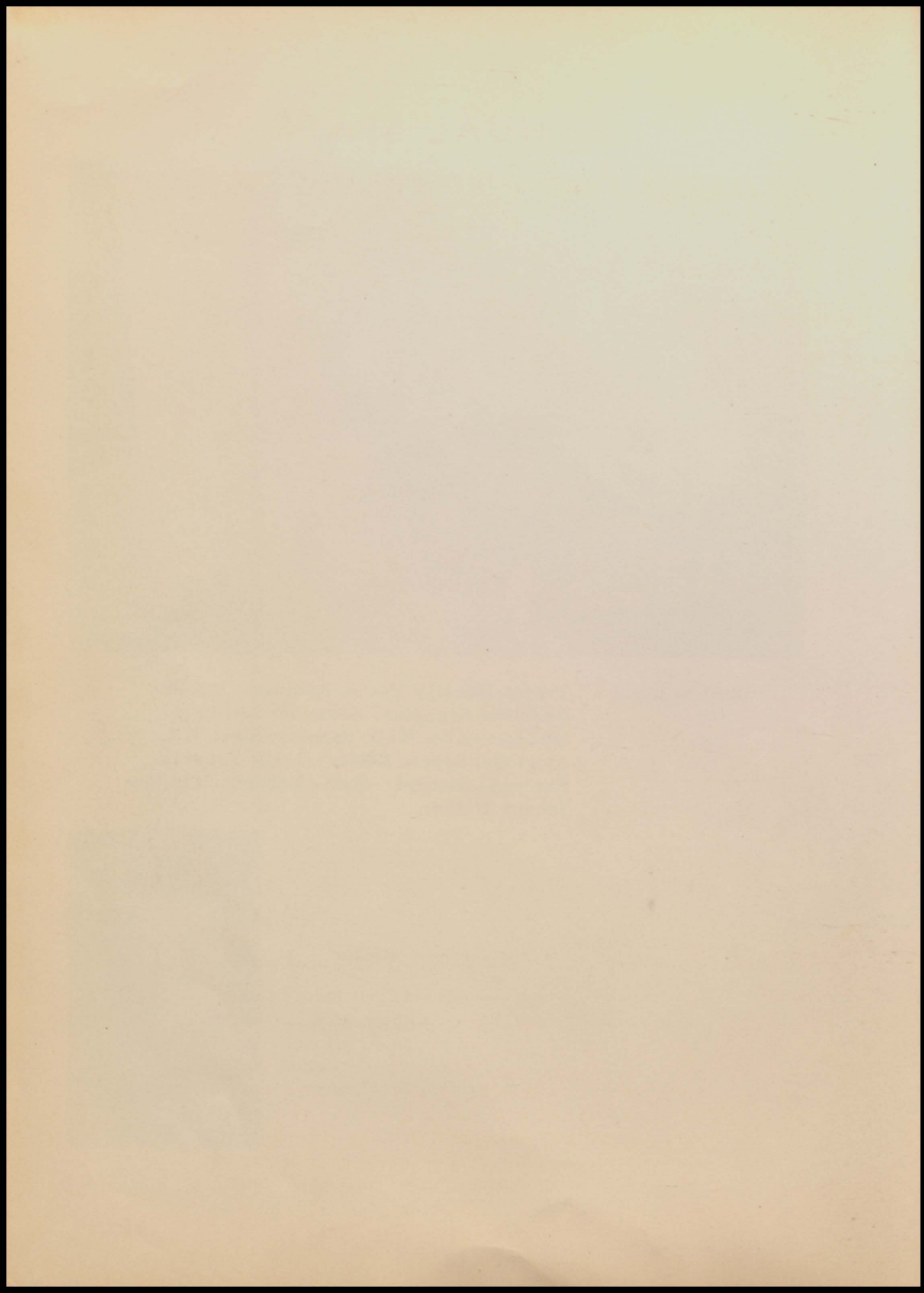

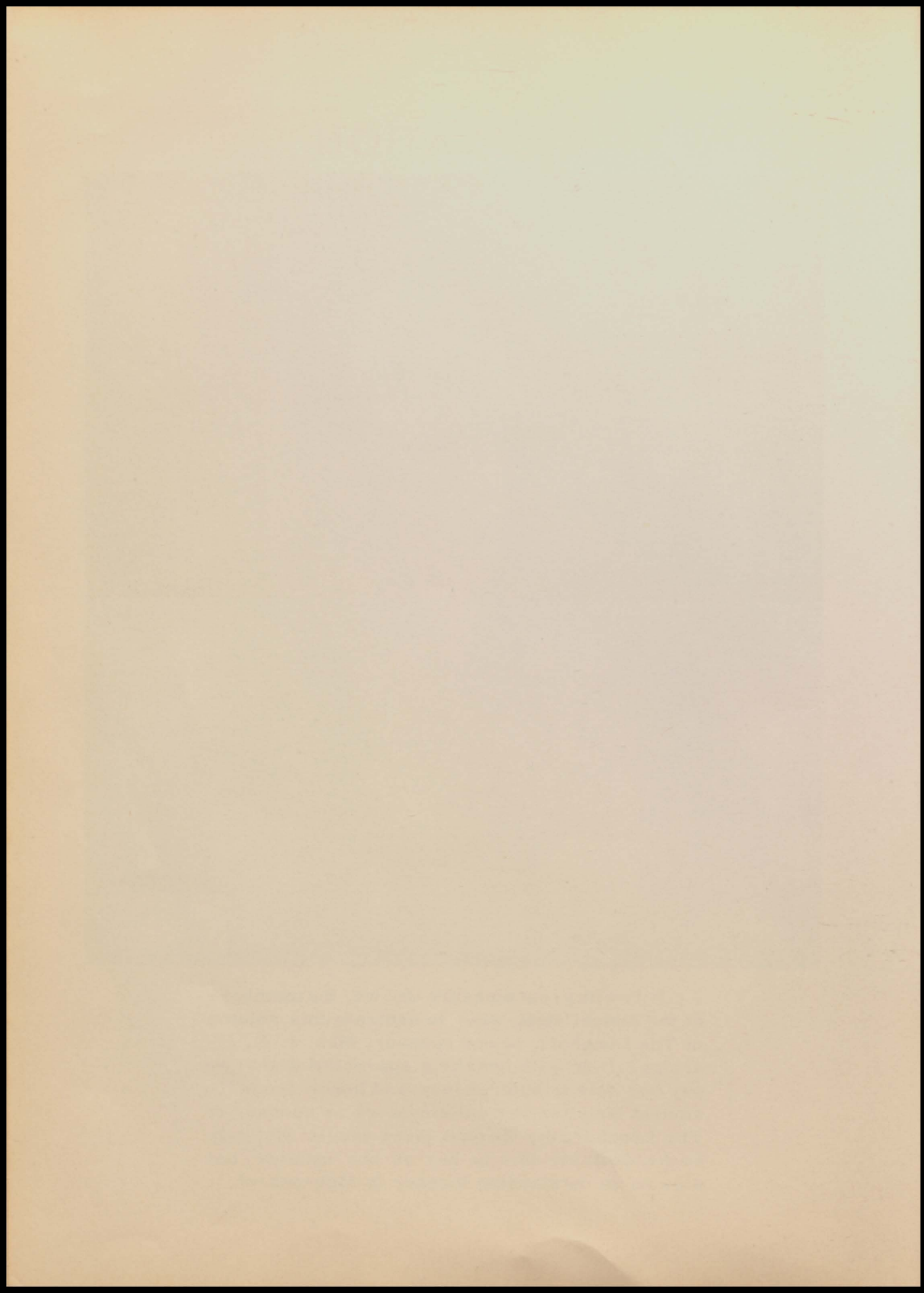




## DEDICATION

I don't think she meant that quite as it sounds, but merely that she would be homesick in those queer places and wish to see her old friends.

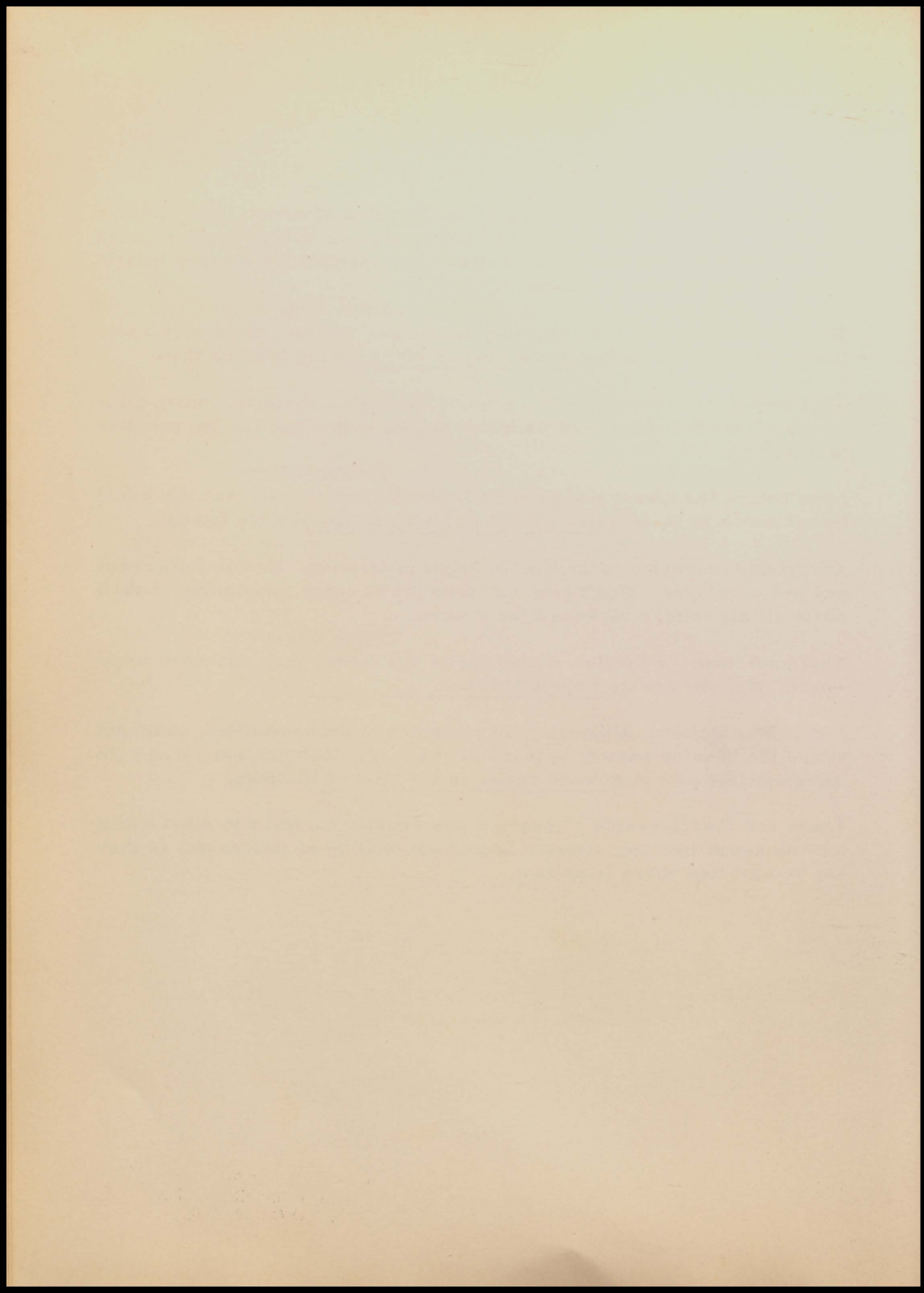
Am private secretary to the head of huge corporation. He was born crazy and had a relapse. Won't give me time off to come to reunion. I shall write all his letters backward for a week.
