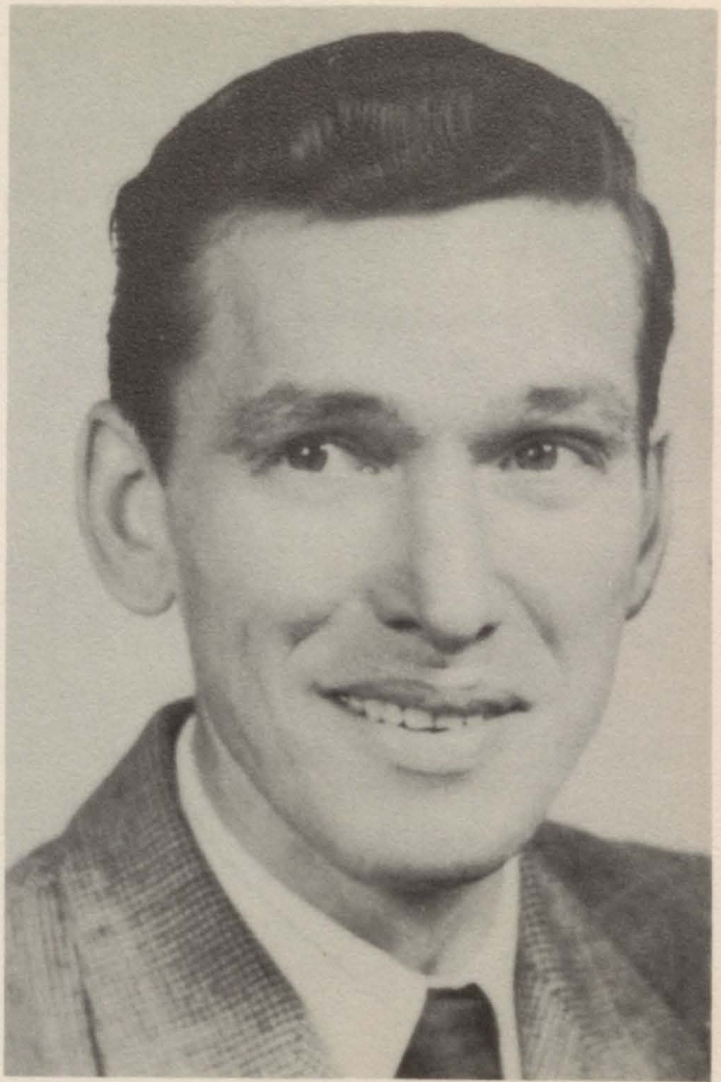
Foreword

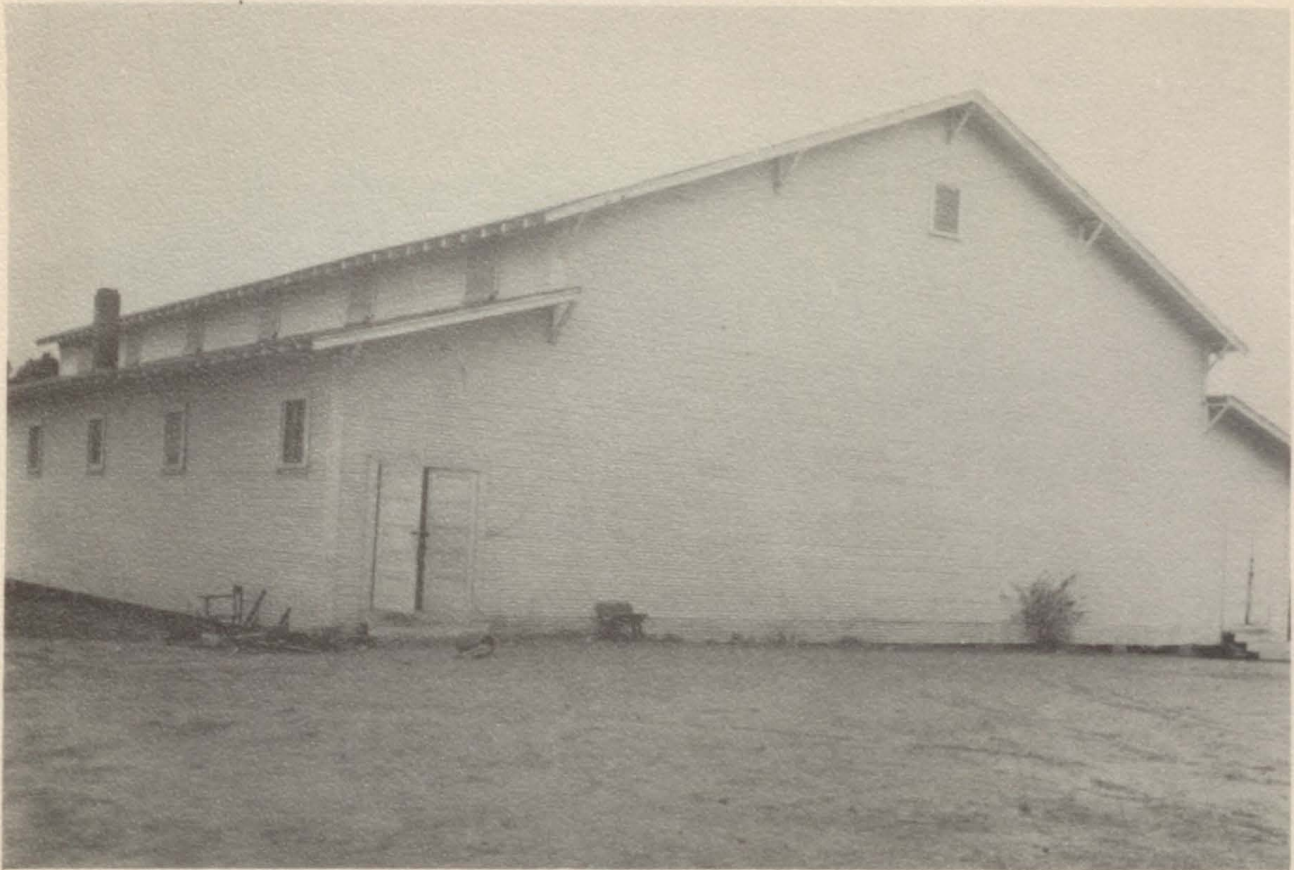

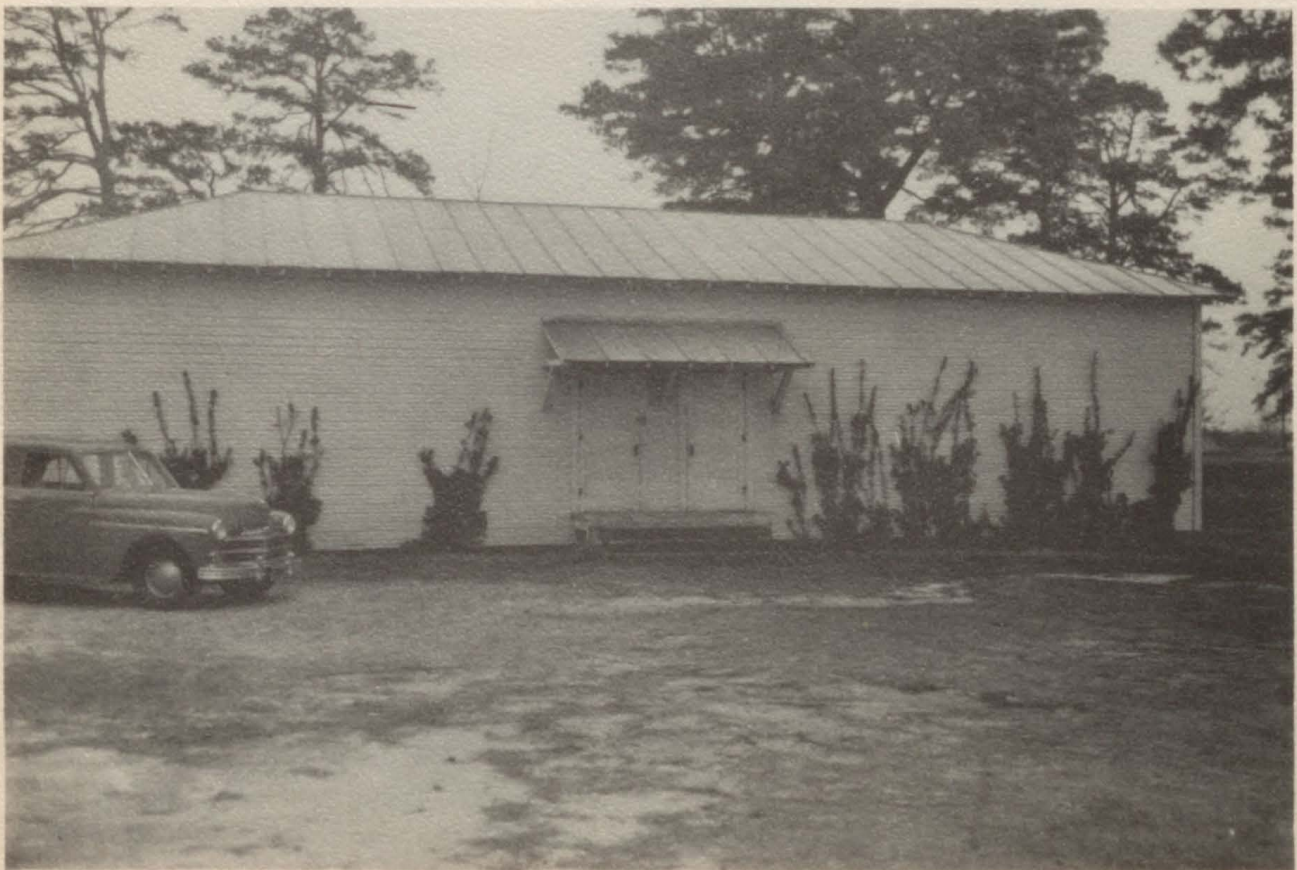

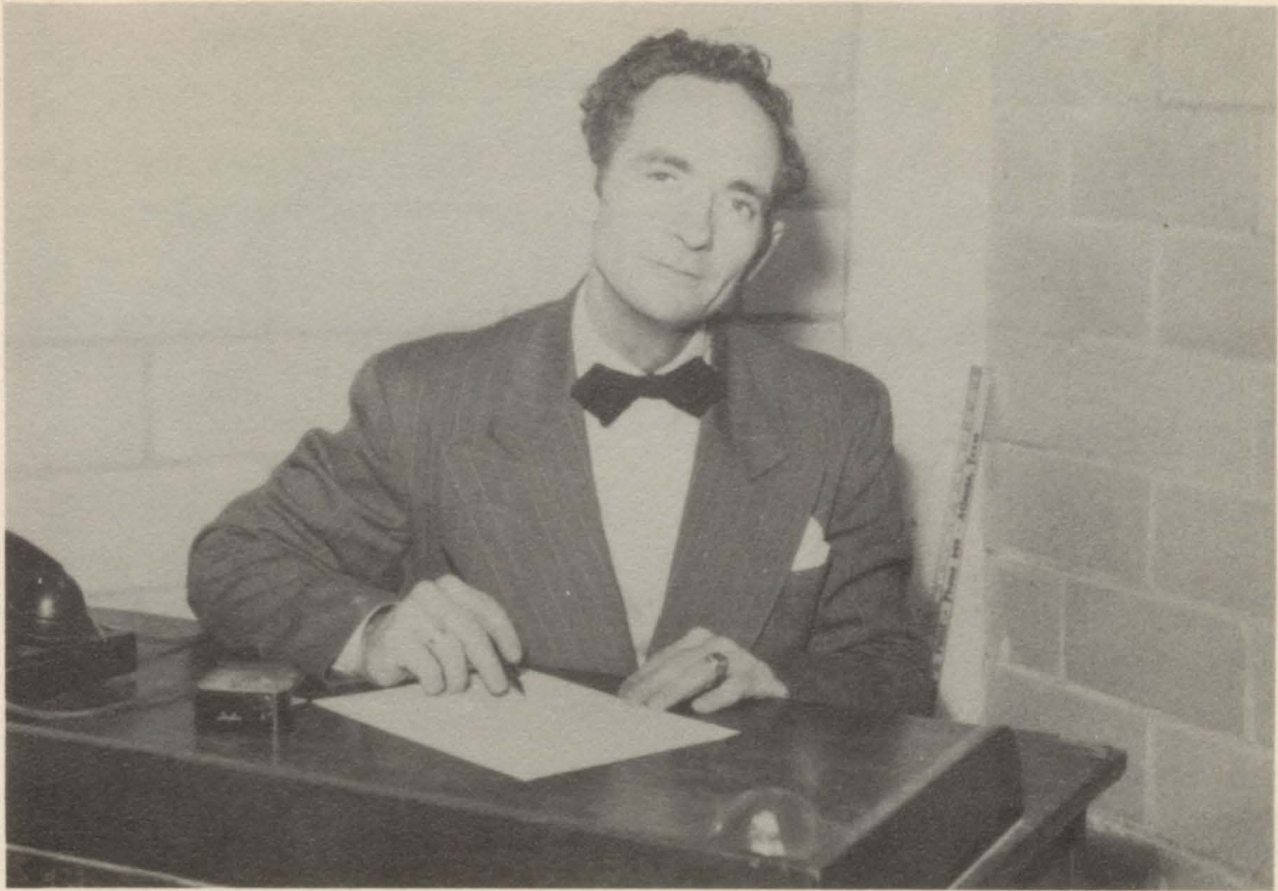

Men and women who can think for themselves, relate knowledge to the general scheme of things, write and speak the English language, will always be in demand.

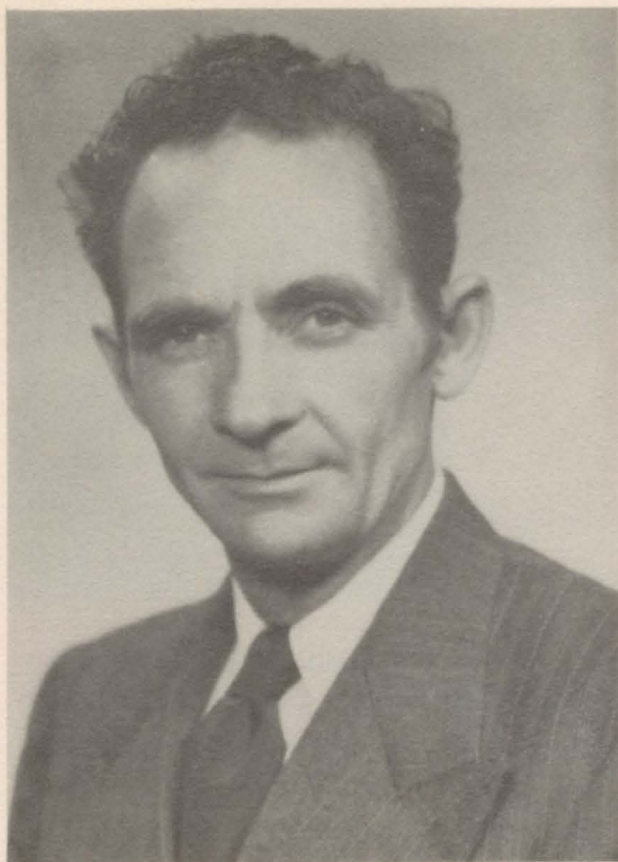
