
Foreword



Men and women who can think for themselves, relate knowledge to the general scheme of things, write and speak the English language, will always be in demand.























HAZEL MOORE ELECTED AS CARNIVAL QUEEN

Her reward as being the Sweetheart was an identical basketball jacket.








