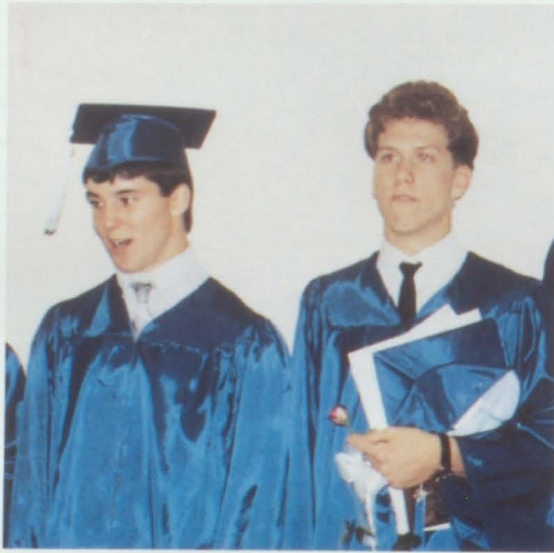

DECA students are better prepared for the world of work after their experiences in the distributive education classes and on the job. For this reason DECA is a very valuable organization for some students at Redwater High School.

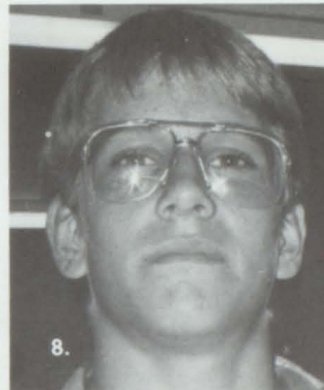

Included in Activities for May were the annual Mother-Daughter Banquet and the 4th Annual Miss Redwater Pageant, which is sponsored each year by the FHA.

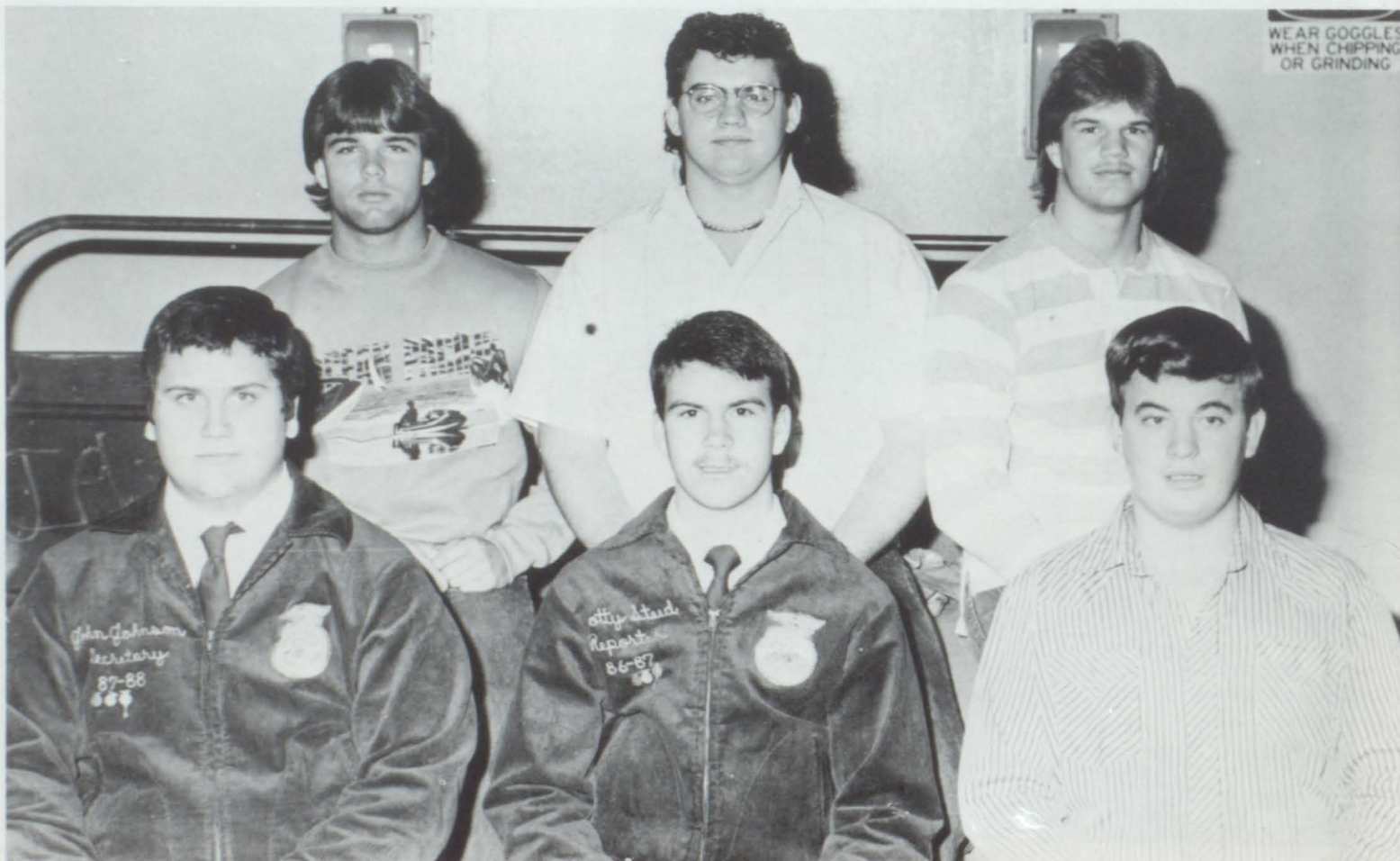
