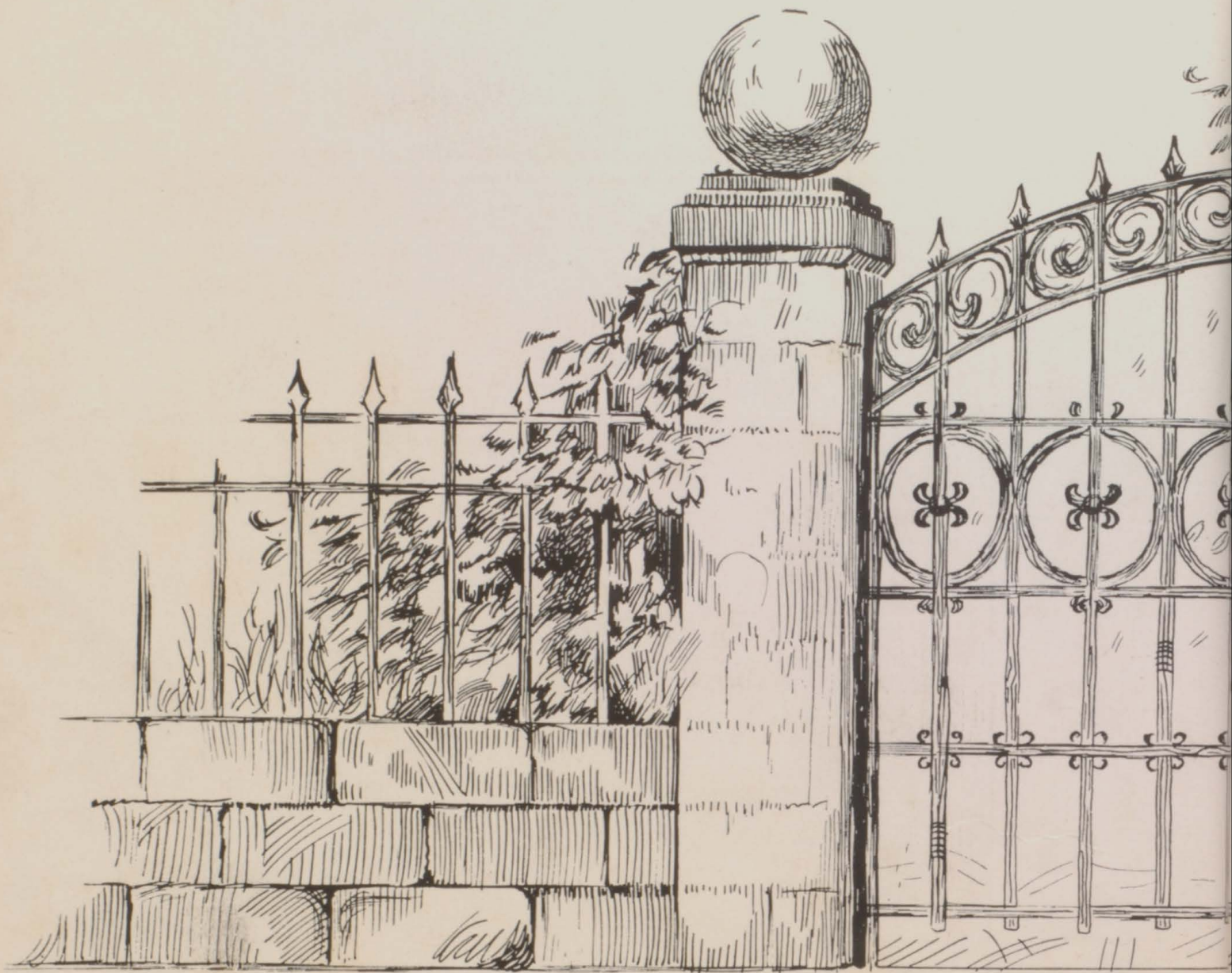




## Foreword



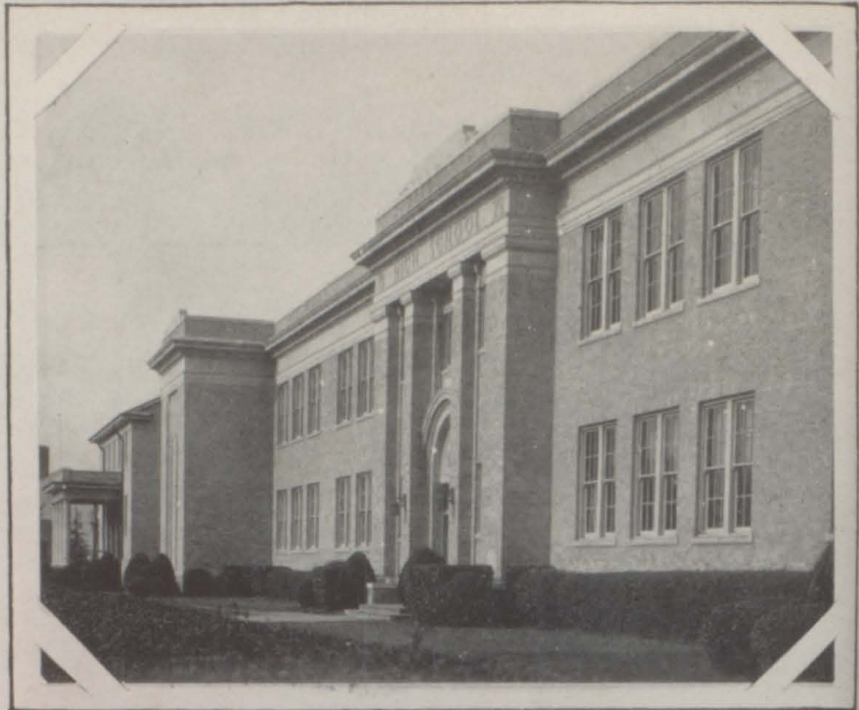

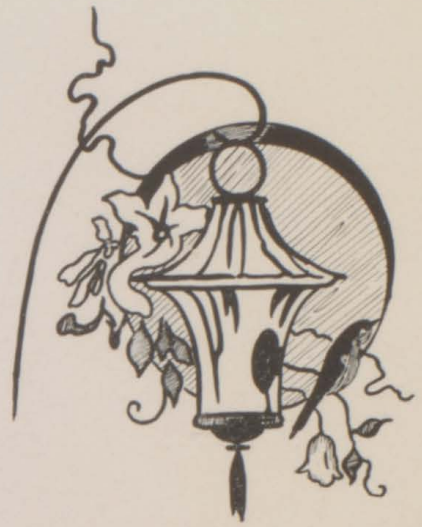

For Education's living flame.

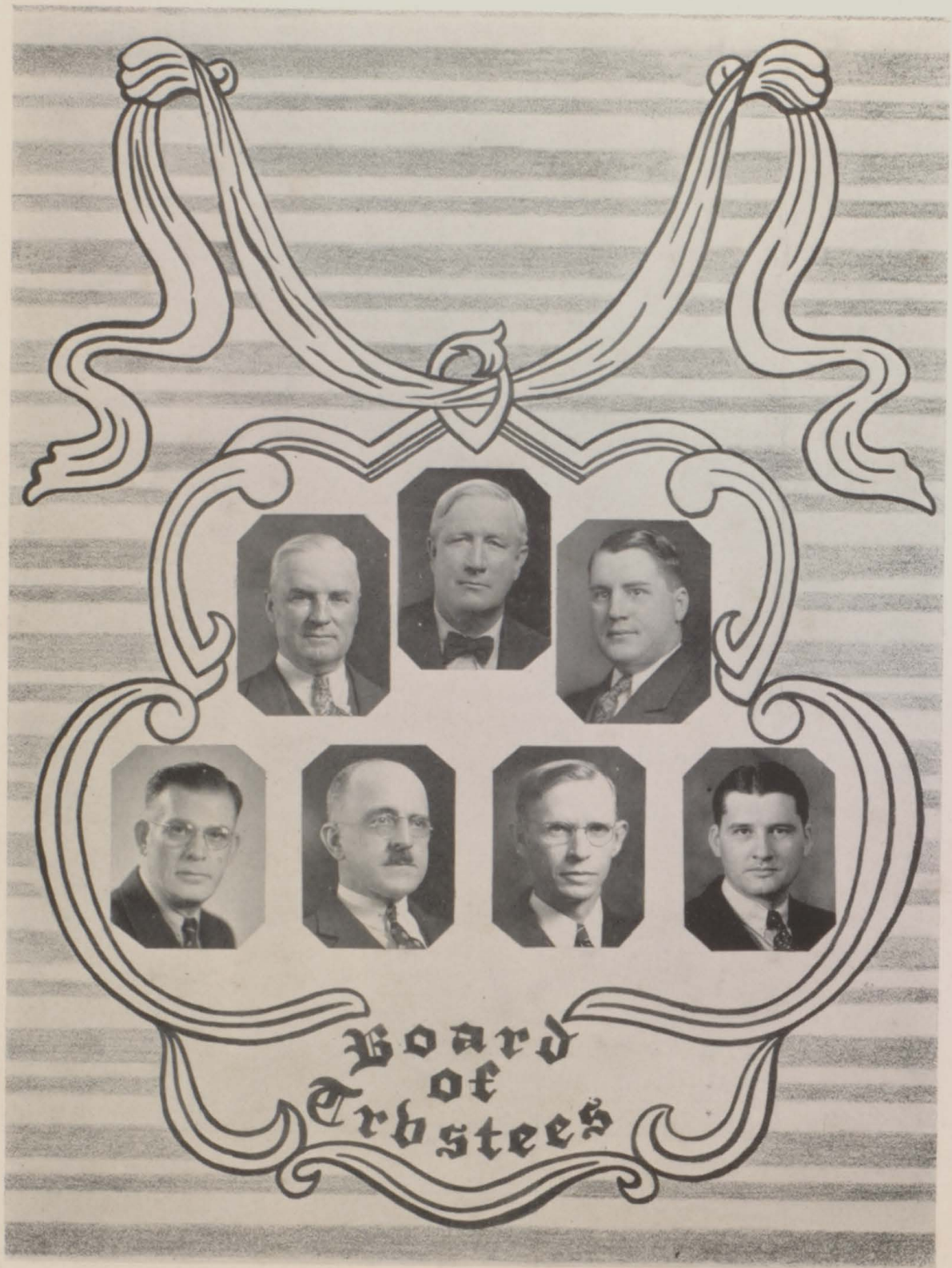

To make our high school life complete, we were entertained at a banquet given in our honor by the Juniors. More than all, we will always remember that Tuesday when we received our sheepskins and whispered a fond farewell to our ever beloved Texas Senior High.

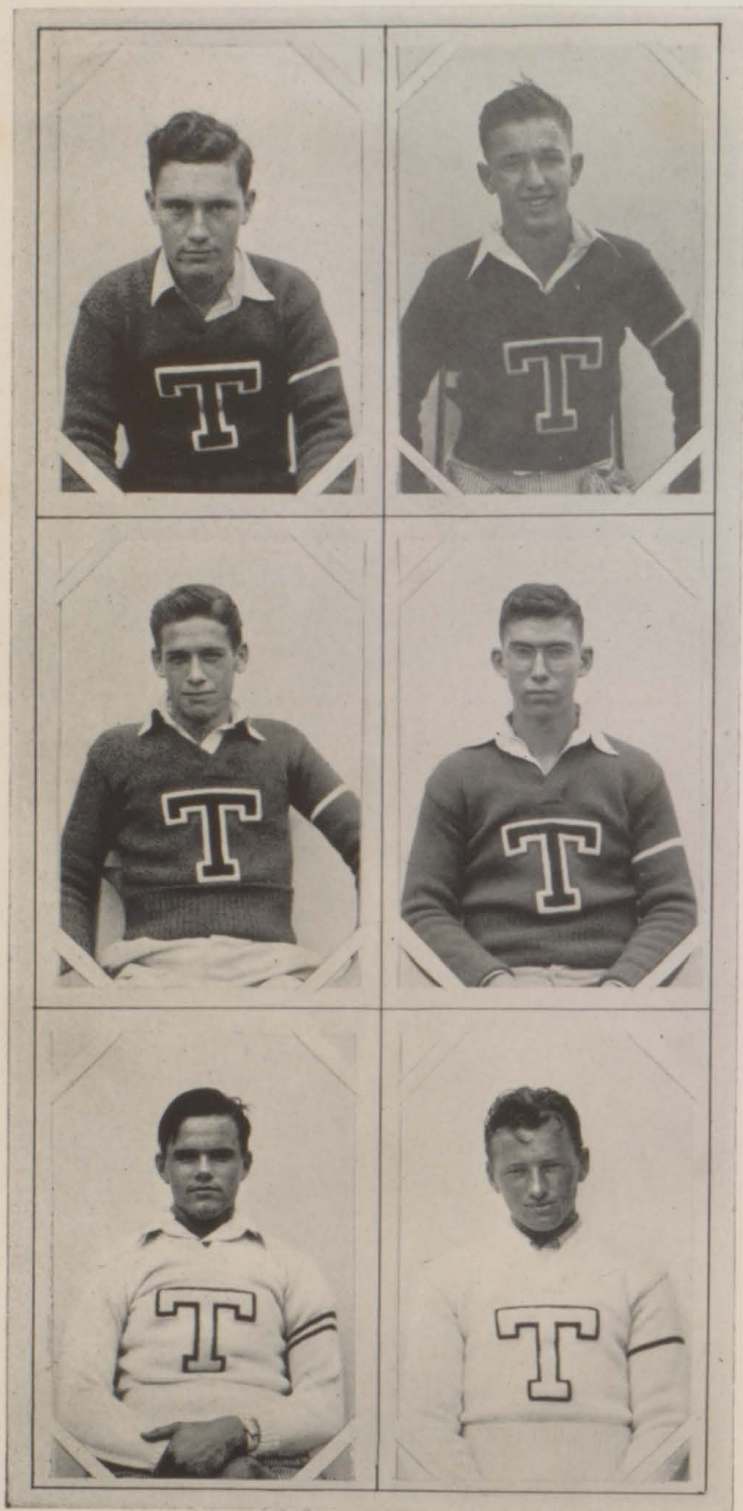
**FREEMAN THOMPSON—Co-Captain-Elect.**

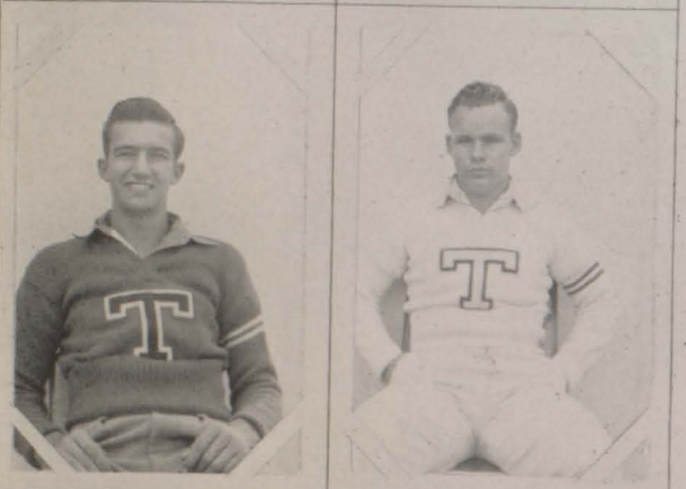


**JACK POWERS (End) Weight 178 pounds.**

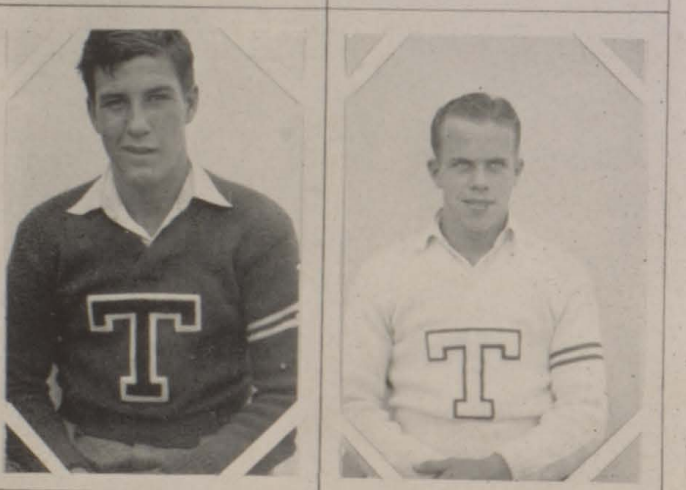


**ALBERT VOGEL (Tackle) Weight 175 pounds.**

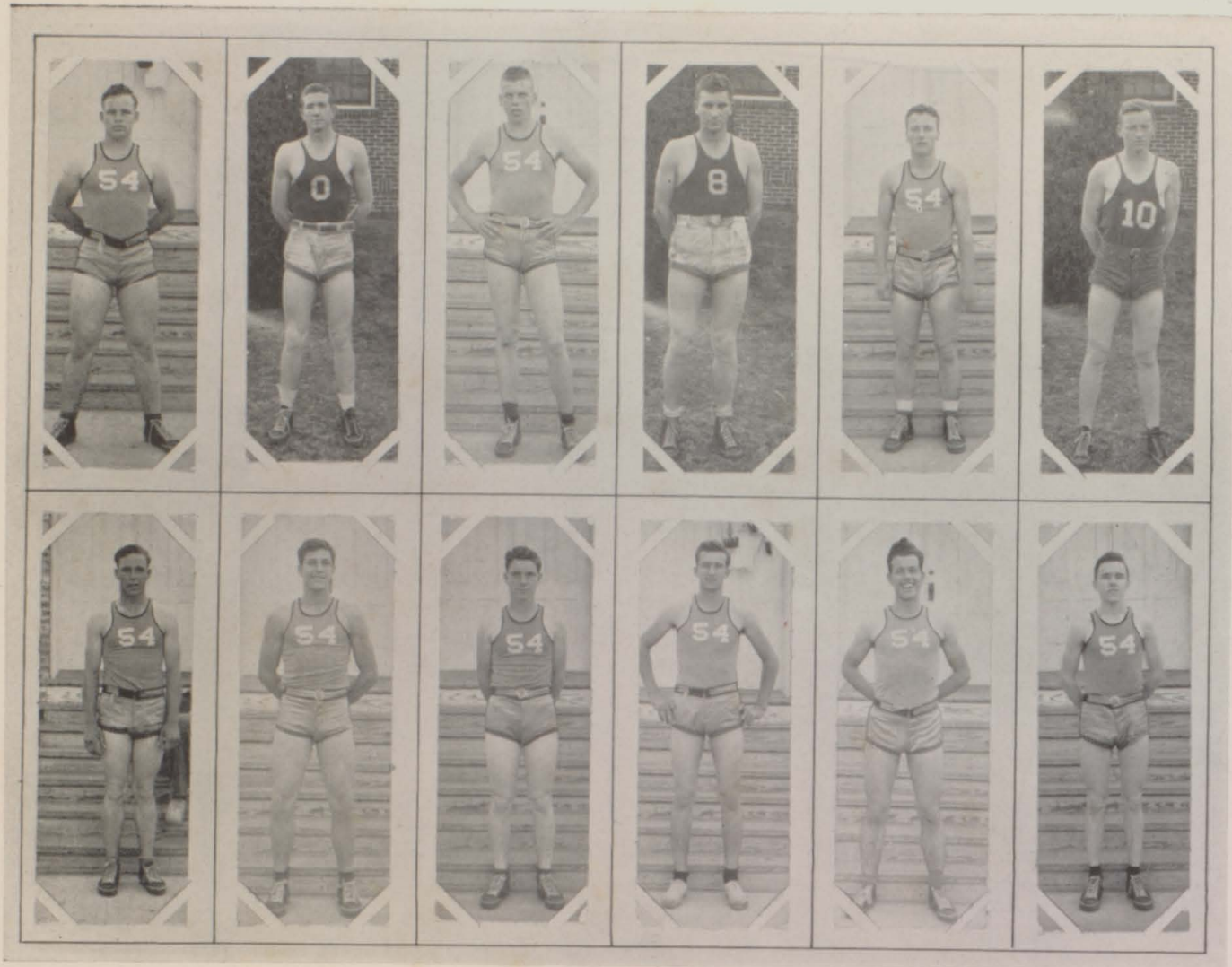
**TOM MILLS—Manager**
